A BILL

To amend the Trade Act of 1974 to exclude from eligibility for the generalized system of preferences any country that fails to effectively enforce its environmental laws or meet its international environmental obligations, and for other purposes.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 This Act may be cited as the “Earth Act”.

1 **SEC. 2. COMPLIANCE WITH ENVIRONMENTAL LAWS AND**
2 **REGULATIONS.**

3 Section 502 of the Trade Act of 1974 (19 U.S.C.
4 2462) is amended—

5 (1) in subsection (b)(2)—

6 (A) by inserting after subparagraph (H)
7 the following new subparagraph:

8 “(I) Such country fails to effectively en-
9 force its environmental laws, regulations, or
10 other measures, or to fulfill its international en-
11 vironmental obligations, including as such obli-
12 gations relate to public health.”; and

13 (B) in the matter following subparagraph
14 (I) (as added by subparagraph (A))—

15 (i) by striking “and (H)” and insert-
16 ing “(H)”; and

17 (ii) by striking “shall not prevent”
18 and inserting “, and (I) shall not prevent”;
19 and

20 (2) in subsection (c)—

21 (A) in paragraph (6)(B), by striking “and”
22 at the end;

23 (B) in paragraph (7), by striking the pe-
24 riod at the end and inserting “; and”; and

25 (C) by adding at the end the following new
26 paragraph:

1 “(8) the extent to which such country effec-
2 tively enforces its environmental laws, regulations,
3 and other measures, and fulfills its international en-
4 vironmental obligations, including as such obliga-
5 tions relate to public health.”.

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
