## A BILL

To prohibit the Secretary of Veterans Affairs from making payments to child care providers that employ individuals charged with certain offenses, and for other purposes.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
- 3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.
- 4 This Act may be cited as the "VA Child Care Protec-
- 5 tion Act of 2019".

1	SEC. 2. REQUIREMENTS FOR CHILD CARE PROVIDERS RE-
2	CEIVING PAYMENT FROM DEPARTMENT OF
3	VETERANS AFFAIRS.
4	(a) In General.—Subject to subsection (b), the Sec-
5	retary of Veterans Affairs may not make a payment to
6	any child care center, child care agency, or child care pro-
7	vider that employs an individual who has been charged
8	with—
9	(1) a sex offense;
10	(2) an offense involving a child victim;
11	(3) a violent crime;
12	(4) a drug felony; or
13	(5) other offense that the Secretary determines
14	appropriate.
15	(b) Exception.—Payment may be made to a child
16	care center, child care agency, or child care provider, if
17	such child care center, child care agency, or child care pro-
18	vider has suspended the individual described in subsection
19	(a) from having any contact with children while on the
20	iob until the case is resolved
