2 **Election Law – Voting Order Priority – Individuals Who Need Extra Assistance**

3 FOR the purpose of requiring a chief election judge to give voting order priority to certain
4 individuals; authorizing certain individuals to request voting order priority of any
5 election judge serving at a polling place or early voting center; ~~requiring the chief~~
6 ~~election judge to determine whether certain individuals qualify for voting order~~
7 ~~priority based on criteria established in regulations adopted by the State Board of~~
8 ~~Elections; requiring individuals who qualify for voting order priority to be brought~~
9 ~~to the front of certain lines and have a certain preference for using the ballot marking~~
10 ~~device or a voting booth~~; requiring the State Board to adopt certain regulations;
11 providing for a delayed effective date; and generally relating to voting order priority
12 for individuals with mobility problems or accompanied by ~~young children or~~ children

19 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND,
20 That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

(A) SUBJECT TO SUBSECTION (B) OF THIS SECTION, A CHIEF ELECTION JUDGE SHALL GIVE VOTING ORDER PRIORITY TO AN INDIVIDUAL:

(1) WHO HAS A MOBILITY PROBLEM THAT SUBSTANTIALLY IMPAIRS THE INDIVIDUAL'S ABILITY TO MOVE AROUND OR STAND;

(2) WHO IS ASSISTING AN INDIVIDUAL DESCRIBED UNDER ITEM (1) OF THIS SUBSECTION; OR

~~(3) WHO IS ACCOMPANIED BY A YOUNG CHILD; OR~~

~~(4)~~ (3) WHO IS ACCOMPANIED BY A CHILD WITH A DISABILITY.

(B) ~~(1)~~ AN INDIVIDUAL DESCRIBED UNDER SUBSECTION (A) OF THIS SECTION MAY REQUEST VOTING ORDER PRIORITY OF ANY ELECTION JUDGE SERVING AT THE POLLING PLACE OR EARLY VOTING CENTER.

~~(2) THE CHIEF ELECTION JUDGE SHALL DETERMINE WHETHER AN INDIVIDUAL QUALIFIES FOR VOTING ORDER PRIORITY BASED ON CRITERIA ESTABLISHED IN REGULATIONS ADOPTED BY THE STATE BOARD.~~

~~(C) AN INDIVIDUAL WHO QUALIFIES FOR VOTING ORDER PRIORITY SHALL:~~

~~(1) BE BROUGHT TO THE FRONT OF THE LINE FOR CHECK IN AND BALLOT ISSUANCE;~~

~~(2) HAVE FIRST PREFERENCE FOR USING THE BALLOT MARKING DEVICE OR A VOTING BOOTH; AND~~

~~(3) BE BROUGHT TO THE FRONT OF THE LINE FOR SCANNING A COMPLETED BALLOT.~~

~~(D)~~ (C) THE STATE BOARD SHALL ADOPT REGULATIONS TO IMPLEMENT THIS SECTION, INCLUDING:

(1) METHODS FOR PROVIDING NOTICE OF THE OPTION TO REQUEST VOTING ORDER PRIORITY TO VOTERS BEFORE AN ELECTION ~~AND~~, AT EACH POLLING PLACE ON ELECTION DAY, AND AT EACH EARLY VOTING CENTER DURING EARLY VOTING; AND

(2) TRAINING GUIDELINES FOR ELECTION JUDGES; ~~AND~~

1 ~~(3) DATA COLLECTION PROCEDURES TO DETERMINE THE USE AND~~
2 ~~EFFECTIVENESS OF VOTING ORDER PRIORITY FOR QUALIFYING INDIVIDUALS.~~

4 January 1, 2021.
