Public and Nonpublic Schools – Bronchodilator <u>and Epinephrine</u> Availability and Use – Policy <u>Policies</u>

FOR the purpose of requiring each county board of education and authorizing nonpublic 4 5 schools in the State to establish a policy to obtain, administer, and train certain 6 school nurses and other school personnel to administer in emergency situations 7 bronchodilators to a student who is determined to have asthma and is experiencing 8 asthma-related symptoms or is perceived to be in respiratory distress by a school 9 nurse or any other school personnel; requiring each county board and authorizing 10 nonpublic schools in the State to update their policies to require certain school nurses 11 and other school personnel to complete a certain training before they are authorized to administer auto-injectable epinephrine to a student who is determined to be, or 12 13 is perceived to be, in anaphylaxis; requiring the State Department of Education, in 14 consultation with certain groups, to identify or develop a training for certain school personnel to identify symptoms of anaphylaxis, asthma, or respiratory distress in 15 students; and generally relating to a bronchodilator and epinephrine availability and 16 17 use policy policies in public and nonpublic schools in the State.
