BY repealing and reenacting, with amendments, Article – Natural Resources Section 10–301(b) Annotated Code of Maryland (2012 Replacement Volume and 2021 Supplement) SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows: Article - Natural Resources 10 - 301.To provide a fund to pay the expense of protecting and managing (b) (1) wildlife, and preventing unauthorized persons from hunting them, a person may not hunt or attempt to hunt during open season and in any permitted manner any game birds and mammals in the State without first having procured either a resident or nonresident hunter's license.
