A BILL FOR AN ACT

CONCERNING EXPANDING THE ROLE OF AN ADVISORY BOARD TO SERVE THE OFFICE OF SCHOOL SAFETY.

Bill Summary

(Note: This summary applies to this bill as introduced and does not reflect any amendments that may be subsequently adopted. If this bill passes third reading in the house of introduction, a bill summary that applies to the reengrossed version of this bill will be available at http://leg.colorado.gov.)

Under current law, the office of school safety (office) oversees the school safety resource center (center) and 2 separate units that assist schools with crisis management and safety-related grant funding, respectively. There is an advisory board that recommends the policies of the center. The bill broadens the scope of the advisory board's work to include policy recommendations for the entire office.

1	Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Colorado:
2	SECTION 1. In Colorado Revised Statutes, amend 24-33.5-1802
3	as follows:
4	24-33.5-1802. Definitions. As used in this part 18, unless the
5	context otherwise requires:
6	(1) "Advisory board" means the school safety resource center
7	advisory board created in the office in the department pursuant to section
8	24-33.5-1804.
9	(2) (1) "Center" means the school safety resource center created in
10	the office pursuant to section 24-33.5-1803.
11	(3) (2) "Director" means the director of the center.
12	(3.3) (3) "First responder" means an individual who responds in a
13	professional capacity to an emergency that occurs in a school building,
14	including, but not limited to, peace officers, firefighters, emergency
15	medical service providers, school administrators, and teachers.
16	(3.5) (4) "Office" means the office of school safety created in
17	section 24-33.5-2702.
18	(4) (5) "School" means an institution at which instruction is
19	provided by instructors to students in one or more buildings on a campus.
20	"School" includes a school serving any of grades preschool through
21	twelve and an institution of higher education.
22	SECTION 2. In Colorado Revised Statutes, add with amended
23	and relocated provisions 24-33.5-2705 as follows:
24	24-33.5-2705. [Formerly 24-33.5-1804] Office of school safety
25	advisory board - created. (1) There is hereby created in the office the
26	school safety resource center OFFICE OF SCHOOL SAFETY advisory board,

3	(2) (a) The advisory board shall consist CONSISTS of not less than
4	fourteen members, each of whom shall be IS appointed to a term of two
5	years as follows:
6	(I) One member shall MUST represent the department of education,
7	created pursuant to section 24-1-115, and be appointed by the
8	commissioner of education.
9	(II) One member shall MUST be an individual with professional
10	expertise in behavioral health treatment who represents an elementary or
11	secondary school or a school district and be appointed by the
12	commissioner of education.
13	(III) One member shall MUST be a school administrator and be
14	appointed by the commissioner in consultation with a statewide
15	association of school executives.
16	(IV) One member shall MUST represent state universities and
17	colleges and be appointed by the executive director of the Colorado
18	commission on higher education appointed pursuant to section 24-1-114.
19	(V) One member shall MUST represent community colleges and
20	local district colleges and be appointed by the state board for community
21	colleges and occupational education created pursuant to section
22	23-60-104. C.R.S.
23	(VI) One member shall MUST be a member of a parents'
24	organization and be appointed by the governor.
25	(VII) One member shall MUST be a district attorney and be
26	appointed by the governor.
27	(VIII) One member shall MUST represent the unit within the

1	department of human services, created pursuant to section 26-1-105,
2	C.R.S., that administers behavioral health programs and services,
3	including those related to mental health and substance abuse, and be
4	appointed by the executive director of the department of human services.
5	(IX) One member shall MUST represent the department of public
6	health and environment, created pursuant to section 25-1-102, C.R.S., and
7	be appointed by the executive director of the department of public health
8	and environment.
9	(X) One member shall MUST represent the Colorado department of
10	law, created pursuant to section 24-1-113, and be appointed by the
11	attorney general.
12	(XI) One member shall MUST represent the department and be
13	appointed by the executive director.
14	(XII) One member shall MUST be an individual with professional
15	expertise in school security and be appointed by the executive director.
16	(XIII) One member shall MUST be a law enforcement professional
17	and be appointed by the executive director.
18	(XIV) One member must be a school resource officer, as defined
19	in section 22-32-109.1 (1), C.R.S., and be appointed by the executive
20	director in consultation with a statewide association representing school
21	resource officers.
22	(b) The appointing authority of each member of the advisory board
23	shall appoint the member on or before October 1, 2008, and reappoint the
24	member or appoint a new member no later than one month before the
25	expiration of the member's term.
26	(c) Additional advisory board members may be added to the
27	advisory board as necessary subject to:

I	(1) The approval of the executive director; and
2	(II) A majority vote of approval by the existing advisory board
3	members.
4	(3) If any member of the advisory board vacates his or her THE
5	MEMBER'S office during the term for which THE MEMBER WAS appointed
6	to the advisory board, the vacancy shall MUST be filled by appointment by
7	the executive director for the unexpired term.
8	(4) The advisory board shall annually elect from its members a
9	chairperson and a secretary.
10	(5) The advisory board shall meet as determined necessary by the
11	director. The members of the advisory board shall receive no
12	compensation but shall be reimbursed by the department for necessary
13	travel and other expenses actually incurred in the performance of their THE
14	MEMBERS' official duties.
15	(6) Repealed.
16	SECTION 3. Repeal of relocated provisions in this act. In
17	Colorado Revised Statutes, repeal 24-33.5-1804.
18	SECTION 4. Safety clause. The general assembly finds,
19	determines, and declares that this act is necessary for the immediate
20	preservation of the public peace, health, or safety or for appropriations for
21	the support and maintenance of the departments of the state and state
22	institutions.
