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

- 23 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND,
- 24 That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect October 1, 2025.
