2	AN ACT TO PROVIDE EDUCATIONAL RECORDS OF MINOR COMMUNITY COLLEGE	
3	STUDENTS TO THE PARENTS OF THE DEPENDENT STUDENT.	
4	The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:	
5	<b>SECTION 1.</b> This act shall be known and may be cited as "Leon's Law."	
6	<b>SECTION 2.</b> Chapter 115D of the General Statutes is amended by adding a new

9	"Academic Records.	
10	"§ 115D-110. Academic records of minor students.	
11	(a) To the extent allowed under the Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act (FERPA),	
12	20 U.S.C. § 1232g, each community college shall make educational records, as defined in 34	
13	C.F.R. § 99.3, of minor students automatically available to the parents, guardians, or an	
14	individual acting as a parent in the absence of a parent or a guardian of the student if the following	
15	<u>criteria are met:</u>	
16	(1) The student is below the age of 18.	
17	(2) The student is a dependent student, as defined in section 152 of the Internal	
18	Revenue Code of 1986.	
19	(3) The parent has not opted out of receiving the records.	
20	(b) Each community college shall require minor students whose educational records are	
21	subject to subsection (a) of this section to complete a form, prior to registration in any course at	
22	the community college, acknowledging that the parents, guardians, or an individual acting as a	
23	parent in the absence of a parent or a guardian of the student has access to the educational records	
24	of the student."	
25	<b>SECTION 3.</b> This act is effective when it becomes law and applies beginning with	
26	the 2025-2026 academic year.
