- (d) (1) Notwithstanding Section 34-29-76, Code of
  Alabama 1975, or any other law to the contrary, emergency
  medical services personnel may provide emergency medical care
  to a police dog injured in the line of duty while at the scene
  of the injury or while the police dog is being transported
  pursuant to subsection (c).

- (2) Emergency medical services personnel who act in good faith to provide emergency medical care to a police dog pursuant to subdivision (1) are immune from criminal or civil liability as it relates to any injury or harm caused to the injured police dog. Emergency medical services personnel are also immune from criminal or civil liability for refusing to treat or transport an injured police dog.
- Section 2. This act shall become effective on October 46 1, 2025.
