A BILL

To require recipients of coronavirus relief funding to publicly disclose how such funds were spent, and for other purposes.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
- 3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.
- 4 This Act may be cited as the "Where's our Money
- 5 Going Act".
- 6 SEC. 2. ACCOUNTABILITY FOR CORONAVIRUS RELIEF
- 7 SPENDING.
- 8 (a) IN GENERAL.—Not later than 6 months after the
- 9 date of enactment of this Act, each State or local govern-
- 10 ment that received funding under any law specified in sub-

- 1 section (c) shall submit a report to Congress detailing the
- 2 funding amounts received and a description of how such
- 3 funds were spent. Such report shall be made publicly avail-
- 4 able on a State or local government website.
- 5 (b) Enforcement.—Any State or local government
- 6 that fails to comply with the requirement in subsection
- 7 (a) shall be liable to the Federal Government for the re-
- 8 payment of any such funds received and shall be ineligible
- 9 for any future coronavirus relief funding otherwise made
- 10 available after the date of enactment of this Act.
- 11 (c) APPLICABLE LAWS.—The laws specified under
- 12 this subsection are the following:
- 13 (1) The Coronavirus Preparedness and Re-
- sponse Supplemental Appropriations Act, 2020.
- 15 (2) The Coronavirus Aid, Relief, and Economic
- 16 Security Act.
- 17 (3) The Consolidated Appropriations Act, 2021.
- 18 (4) The American Rescue Plan Act of 2021.
