	(b) "Postvention" means mental health intervention after a suicide attempt or death to

84	to a school district or charter school to be used to implement evidence-based practices and
85	programs, or emerging best practices and programs, for preventing suicide in the school district
86	or charter school.
87	(b) The state board shall distribute money under Subsection $[(6)]$ (7)(a) so that each
88	school [that enrolls students in grade 7 or a higher grade] receives an allocation of at least
89	[\$1.000] \$500.

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90	(c) (i) A school shall use money allocated to the school under Subsection $[(6)]$ (7) (b) to
91	implement evidence-based practices and programs, or emerging best practices and programs,
92	for preventing suicide.
93	(ii) Each school may select the evidence-based practices and programs, or emerging
94	best practices and programs, for preventing suicide that the school implements.
