A BILL

To extend the authority for the establishment of a commemorative work to honor enslaved and free Black persons who served in the American Revolution, and for other purposes.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
- 3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.
- 4 This Act may be cited as the "National Liberty Me-
- 5 morial Preservation Act".
- 6 SEC. 2. FINDINGS.
- 7 Congress finds that the period preceding the 250th
- 8 anniversary of the founding of the United States on July

- 1 4, 1776, offers the best conditions in ten generations to
- 2 honor and preserve the contributions of enslaved and free
- 3 Black soldiers and civilians to independence by the tri-
- 4 umph of a permanent National Liberty Memorial rep-
- 5 resenting deeds Congress on two previous occasions de-
- 6 clared of "preeminent historical and lasting significance
- 7 to the nation".
- 8 SEC. 3. EXTENSION OF AUTHORITY FOR ESTABLISHMENT
- 9 OF COMMEMORATIVE WORK.
- Notwithstanding section 8903(e) of title 40, United
- 11 States Code, the authority provided by section 2860 of the
- 12 Military Construction Authorization Act for Fiscal Year
- 13 2013 (division B of Public Law 112–239; 126 Stat. 2164;
- 14 40 U.S.C. 8903 note) shall continue to apply through Sep-
- 15 tember 30, 2027.
