A BILL

To amend the Internal Revenue Code of 1986 to ensure that electrochromic glass qualifies as energy property for purposes of the energy credit.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
- 3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.
- This Act may be cited as the "Dynamic Glass Act".
- 5 SEC. 2. INCLUSION OF ELECTROCHROMIC GLASS AS EN-
- 6 ERGY PROPERTY.
- 7 (a) In General.—Clause (i) of section 48(a)(3)(A)
- 8 of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986 is amended by in-
- 9 serting "(including use of electrochromic glass)" after "a
- 10 structure".

- 1 (b) Effective Date.—The amendment made by
- 2 this section shall apply to taxable years beginning after

3 the date of the enactment of this Act.
