A BILL

To amend section 4501.21 and to enact section 1
4503.506 of the Revised Code to create the "A 2
Kid Again" license plate. 3

BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF OHIO:

Section 1. That section 4501.21 be amended and section 4
4503.506 of the Revised Code be enacted to read as follows: 5

Sec. 4501.21. (A) There is hereby created in the state 6
treasury the license plate contribution fund. The fund shall 7
consist of all contributions paid by motor vehicle registrants 8
and collected by the registrar of motor vehicles pursuant to 9
sections 4503.491, 4503.492, 4503.493, 4503.494, 4503.495, 10
4503.496, 4503.497, 4503.498, 4503.499, 4503.4910, 4503.4911, 11
4503.50, 4503.501, 4503.502, 4503.505, 4503.506, 4503.51, 12
4503.514, 4503.521, 4503.522, 4503.523, 4503.524, 4503.525, 13

(B) The registrar shall pay the contributions the 29
registrar collects in the fund as follows: 30

The registrar shall pay the contributions received 31
pursuant to section 4503.491 of the Revised Code to the breast 32
cancer fund of Ohio, which shall use that money only to pay for 33
programs that provide assistance and education to Ohio breast 34
cancer patients and that improve access for such patients to 35
quality health care and clinical trials and shall not use any of 36
the money for abortion information, counseling, services, or 37
other abortion-related activities. 38

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 39
receives pursuant to section 4503.492 of the Revised Code to the 40
organization cancer support community central Ohio, which shall 41
deposit the money into the Sheryl L. Kraner Fund of that 42
organization. Cancer support community central Ohio shall expend 43
the money it receives pursuant to this division only in the same 44
manner and for the same purposes as that organization expends 45
other money in that fund. 46

The registrar shall pay the contributions received 47
pursuant to section 4503.493 of the Revised Code to the autism 48

society of Ohio, which shall use the contributions for programs 49
and autism awareness efforts throughout the state. 50

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 51
receives pursuant to section 4503.494 of the Revised Code to the 52
national multiple sclerosis society for distribution in equal 53
amounts to the northwestern Ohio, Ohio buckeye, and Ohio valley 54
chapters of the national multiple sclerosis society. These 55
chapters shall use the money they receive under this section to 56
assist in paying the expenses they incur in providing services 57
directly to their clients. 58

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 59
receives pursuant to section 4503.495 of the Revised Code to the 60
national pancreatic cancer foundation, which shall use the money 61
it receives under this section to assist those who suffer with 62
pancreatic cancer and their families. 63

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 64
receives pursuant to section 4503.496 of the Revised Code to the 65
Ohio sickle cell and health association, which shall use the 66
contributions to help support educational, clinical, and social 67
support services for adults who have sickle cell disease. 68

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 69
receives pursuant to section 4503.497 of the Revised Code to the 70
St. Baldrick's foundation, which shall use the contributions for 71
its research and other programs. 72

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 73
receives pursuant to section 4503.498 of the Revised Code to 74
special olympics Ohio, inc., which shall use the contributions 75
for its programs, charitable efforts, and other activities. 76

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 77

receives pursuant to section 4503.499 of the Revised Code to the 78
children's glioma cancer foundation, which shall use the 79
contributions for its research and other programs. 80

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 81
receives pursuant to section 4503.4910 of the Revised Code to 82
the KylerStrong foundation, which shall use the contributions to 83
raise awareness of brain cancer caused by diffuse intrinsic 84
pontine glioma and to fund research for the cure of such cancer. 85

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 86
receives pursuant to section 4503.4911 of the Revised Code to 87
the research institution for childhood cancer at nationwide 88
children's hospital, which shall use the contributions to fund 89
research for the cure of childhood cancers. 90

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 91
receives pursuant to section 4503.50 of the Revised Code to the 92
future farmers of America foundation, which shall deposit the 93
contributions into its general account to be used for 94
educational and scholarship purposes of the future farmers of 95
America foundation. 96

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 97
receives pursuant to section 4503.501 of the Revised Code to the 98
4-H youth development program of the Ohio state university 99
extension program, which shall use those contributions to pay 100
the expenses it incurs in conducting its educational activities. 101

The registrar shall pay the contributions received 102
pursuant to section 4503.502 of the Revised Code to the Ohio 103
cattlemen's foundation, which shall use those contributions for 104
scholarships and other educational activities. 105

The registrar shall pay the contributions received 106

pursuant to section 4503.505 of the Revised Code to the 107
organization Ohio region phi theta kappa, which shall use those 108
contributions for scholarships for students who are members of 109
that organization. 110

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 111
receives pursuant to section 4503.506 of the Revised Code to a 112
kid again, incorporated for distribution in equal amounts to the 113
Ohio chapters of a kid again. 114

The registrar shall pay each contribution the registrar 115
receives pursuant to section 4503.51 of the Revised Code to the 116
university or college whose name or marking or design appears on 117
collegiate license plates that are issued to a person under that 118
section. A university or college that receives contributions 119
from the fund shall deposit the contributions into its general 120
scholarship fund. 121

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 122
receives pursuant to section 4503.514 of the Revised Code to the 123
university of Notre Dame in South Bend, Indiana, for purposes of 124
awarding grants or scholarships to residents of Ohio who attend 125
the university. The university shall not use any of the funds it 126
receives for purposes of administering the scholarship program. 127
The registrar shall enter into appropriate agreements with the 128
university of Notre Dame to effectuate the distribution of such 129
funds as provided in this section. 130

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 131
receives pursuant to section 4503.521 of the Revised Code to the 132
Ohio bicycle federation to assist that organization in paying 133
for the educational programs it sponsors in support of Ohio 134
cyclists of all ages. 135

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.522 of the Revised Code to the "friends of Perry's victory and international peace memorial, incorporated," a nonprofit corporation organized under the laws of this state, to assist that organization in paying the expenses it incurs in sponsoring or holding charitable, educational, and cultural events at the monument.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.523 of the Revised Code to the fairport lights foundation, which shall use the money to pay for the restoration, maintenance, and preservation of the lighthouses of fairport harbor.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.524 of the Revised Code to the Massillon tiger football booster club, which shall use the contributions only to promote and support the football team of Washington high school of the Massillon city school district.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.525 of the Revised Code to the United States power squadron districts seven, eleven, twenty-four, and twenty-nine in equal amounts. Each power squadron district shall use the money it receives under this section to pay for the educational boating programs each district holds or sponsors within this state.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.526 of the Revised Code to the Ohio district Kiwanis foundation of the Ohio district of Kiwanis international, which shall use the money it receives under this section to pay the costs of its educational and humanitarian activities.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.528 of the Revised Code to the Ohio children's alliance, which shall use the money it receives under this section to pay the expenses it incurs in advancing its mission of sustainably improving the provision of services to children, young adults, and families in this state.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.529 of the Revised Code to the Ohio nurses foundation. The foundation shall use the money it receives under this section to provide educational scholarships to assist individuals who aspire to join the nursing profession, to assist nurses in the nursing profession who seek to advance their education, and to support persons conducting nursing research concerning the evidence-based practice of nursing and the improvement of patient outcomes.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.531 of the Revised Code to the thank you foundation, incorporated, a nonprofit corporation organized under the laws of this state, to assist that organization in paying for the charitable activities and programs it sponsors in support of United States military personnel, veterans, and their families.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.534 of the Revised Code to the disabled American veterans department of Ohio, to be used for programs that serve disabled American veterans and their families.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.55 of the Revised Code to the pro football hall of fame, which shall deposit the contributions

into a special bank account that it establishes and which shall 196
be separate and distinct from any other account the pro football 197
hall of fame maintains, to be used exclusively for the purpose 198
of promoting the pro football hall of fame as a travel 199
destination. 200

The registrar shall pay the contributions that are paid to 201
the registrar pursuant to section 4503.545 of the Revised Code 202
to the national rifle association foundation, which shall use 203
the money to pay the costs of the educational activities and 204
programs the foundation holds or sponsors in this state. 205

The registrar shall pay to the Ohio pet fund the 206
contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 207
4503.551 of the Revised Code and any other money from any other 208
source, including donations, gifts, and grants, that is 209
designated by the source to be paid to the Ohio pet fund. The 210
Ohio pet fund shall use the moneys it receives under this 211
section to support programs for the sterilization of dogs and 212
cats and for educational programs concerning the proper 213
veterinary care of those animals, and for expenses of the Ohio 214
pet fund that are reasonably necessary for it to obtain and 215
maintain its tax-exempt status and to perform its duties. 216

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 217
receives pursuant to section 4503.552 of the Revised Code to the 218
rock and roll hall of fame and museum, incorporated. 219

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 220
receives pursuant to section 4503.553 of the Revised Code to the 221
Ohio coalition for animals, incorporated, a nonprofit 222
corporation. Except as provided in division (B) of this section, 223
the coalition shall distribute the money to its members, and the 224
members shall use the money only to pay for educational, 225

charitable, and other programs of each coalition member that 226
provide care for unwanted, abused, and neglected horses. The 227
Ohio coalition for animals may use a portion of the money to pay 228
for reasonable marketing costs incurred in the design and 229
promotion of the license plate and for administrative costs 230
incurred in the disbursement and management of funds received 231
under this section. 232

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 233
receives pursuant to section 4503.554 of the Revised Code to the 234
Ohio state council of the knights of Columbus, which shall use 235
the contributions to pay for its charitable activities and 236
programs. 237

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 238
receives pursuant to section 4503.555 of the Revised Code to the 239
western reserve historical society, which shall use the 240
contributions to fund the Crawford auto aviation museum. 241

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 242
receives pursuant to section 4503.556 of the Revised Code to the 243
Erica J. Holloman foundation, inc., for the awareness of triple 244
negative breast cancer. The foundation shall use the 245
contributions for charitable and educational purposes. 246

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 247
receives pursuant to section 4503.561 of the Revised Code to the 248
state of Ohio chapter of ducks unlimited, inc., which shall 249
deposit the contributions into a special bank account that it 250
establishes. The special bank account shall be separate and 251
distinct from any other account the state of Ohio chapter of 252
ducks unlimited, inc., maintains and shall be used exclusively 253
for the purpose of protecting, enhancing, restoring, and 254
managing wetlands and conserving wildlife habitat. The state of 255

Ohio chapter of ducks unlimited, inc., annually shall notify the 256
registrar in writing of the name, address, and account to which 257
such payments are to be made. 258

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 259
receives pursuant to section 4503.562 of the Revised Code to the 260
Mahoning river consortium, which shall use the money to pay the 261
expenses it incurs in restoring and maintaining the Mahoning 262
river watershed. 263

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 264
receives pursuant to section 4503.564 of the Revised Code to 265
Antioch college for the use of the Glen Helen ecology institute 266
to pay expenses related to the Glen Helen nature preserve. 267

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 268
receives pursuant to section 4503.565 of the Revised Code to the 269
conservancy for Cuyahoga valley national park, which shall use 270
the money in support of the park. 271

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 272
receives pursuant to section 4503.566 of the Revised Code to the 273
Ottawa national wildlife refuge, which shall use the 274
contributions for wildlife preservation purposes. 275

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 276
receives pursuant to section 4503.567 of the Revised Code to the 277
girls on the run of Franklin county, inc., which shall use the 278
contributions to support the activities of the organization. 279

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 280
receives pursuant to section 4503.576 of the Revised Code to the 281
Ohio state beekeepers association, which shall use those 282
contributions to promote beekeeping, provide educational 283
information about beekeeping, and to support other state and 284

local beekeeping programs. 285

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 286
receives pursuant to section 4503.577 of the Revised Code to the 287
national aviation hall of fame, which shall use the 288
contributions to fulfill its mission of honoring aerospace 289
legends to inspire future leaders. 290

The registrar shall pay to a sports commission created 291
pursuant to section 4503.591 of the Revised Code each 292
contribution the registrar receives under that section that an 293
applicant pays to obtain license plates that bear the logo of a 294
professional sports team located in the county of that sports 295
commission and that is participating in the license plate 296
program pursuant to division (E) of that section, irrespective 297
of the county of residence of an applicant. 298

The registrar shall pay to a community charity each 299
contribution the registrar receives under section 4503.591 of 300
the Revised Code that an applicant pays to obtain license plates 301
that bear the logo of a professional sports team that is 302
participating in the license plate program pursuant to division 303
(G) of that section. 304

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 305
receives pursuant to section 4503.592 of the Revised Code to 306
pollinator partnership's monarch wings across Ohio program, 307
which shall use the contributions for the protection and 308
preservation of the monarch butterfly and pollinator corridor in 309
Ohio and for educational programs. 310

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 311
receives pursuant to section 4503.594 of the Revised Code to 312
pelotonia, which shall use the contributions for the purpose of 313

supporting cancer research. 314

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 315
receives pursuant to section 4503.595 of the Revised Code to the 316
Stan Hywet hall and gardens. 317

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 318
receives pursuant to section 4503.67 of the Revised Code to the 319
Dan Beard council of the boy scouts of America. The council 320
shall distribute all contributions in an equitable manner 321
throughout the state to regional councils of the boy scouts. 322

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 323
receives pursuant to section 4503.68 of the Revised Code to the 324
great river council of the girl scouts of the United States of 325
America. The council shall distribute all contributions in an 326
equitable manner throughout the state to regional councils of 327
the girl scouts. 328

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 329
receives pursuant to section 4503.69 of the Revised Code to the 330
Dan Beard council of the boy scouts of America. The council 331
shall distribute all contributions in an equitable manner 332
throughout the state to regional councils of the boy scouts. 333

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 334
receives pursuant to section 4503.701 of the Revised Code to the 335
Prince Hall grand lodge of free and accepted masons of Ohio, 336
which shall use the contributions for scholarship purposes. 337

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 338
receives pursuant to section 4503.702 of the Revised Code to the 339
Ohio Association of the Improved Benevolent and Protective Order 340
of the Elks of the World, which shall use the funds for 341
charitable purposes. 342

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 343
receives pursuant to section 4503.71 of the Revised Code to the 344
fraternal order of police of Ohio, incorporated, which shall 345
deposit the fees into its general account to be used for 346
purposes of the fraternal order of police of Ohio, incorporated. 347

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 348
receives pursuant to section 4503.711 of the Revised Code to the 349
fraternal order of police of Ohio, incorporated, which shall 350
deposit the contributions into an account that it creates to be 351
used for the purpose of advancing and protecting the law 352
enforcement profession, promoting improved law enforcement 353
methods, and teaching respect for law and order. 354

The registrar shall pay the contributions received 355
pursuant to section 4503.712 of the Revised Code to Ohio 356
concerns of police survivors, which shall use those 357
contributions to provide whatever assistance may be appropriate 358
to the families of Ohio law enforcement officers who are killed 359
in the line of duty. 360

The registrar shall pay the contributions received 361
pursuant to section 4503.713 of the Revised Code to the greater 362
Cleveland peace officers memorial society, which shall use those 363
contributions to honor law enforcement officers who have died in 364
the line of duty and support its charitable purposes. 365

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 366
receives pursuant to section 4503.715 of the Revised Code to the 367
fallen linemen organization, which shall use the contributions 368
to recognize and memorialize fallen linemen and support their 369
families. 370

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 371

receives pursuant to section 4503.72 of the Revised Code to the 372
organization known on March 31, 2003, as the Ohio CASA/GAL 373
association, a private, nonprofit corporation organized under 374
Chapter 1702. of the Revised Code. The Ohio CASA/GAL association 375
shall use these contributions to pay the expenses it incurs in 376
administering a program to secure the proper representation in 377
the courts of this state of abused, neglected, and dependent 378
children, and for the training and supervision of persons 379
participating in that program. 380

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 381
receives pursuant to section 4503.722 of the Revised Code to the 382
Down Syndrome Association of Central Ohio, which shall use the 383
contributions for advocacy purposes throughout the state. 384

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 385
receives pursuant to section 4503.73 of the Revised Code to 386
Wright B. Flyer, incorporated, which shall deposit the 387
contributions into its general account to be used for purposes 388
of Wright B. Flyer, incorporated. 389

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 390
receives pursuant to section 4503.732 of the Revised Code to the 391
Siegel Shuster society, a nonprofit organization dedicated to 392
commemorating and celebrating the creation of Superman in 393
Cleveland, Ohio. 394

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 395
receives pursuant to section 4503.733 of the Revised Code to the 396
central Ohio chapter of the juvenile diabetes research 397
foundation, which shall distribute the contributions to the 398
chapters of the juvenile diabetes research foundation in whose 399
geographic territory the person who paid the contribution 400
resides. 401

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 402
receives pursuant to section 4503.734 of the Revised Code to the 403
Ohio highway patrol auxiliary foundation, which shall use the 404
contributions to fulfill the foundation's mission of supporting 405
law enforcement education and assistance. 406

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 407
receives pursuant to section 4503.74 of the Revised Code to the 408
Columbus zoological park association, which shall disburse the 409
moneys to Ohio's major metropolitan zoos, as defined in section 410
4503.74 of the Revised Code, in accordance with a written 411
agreement entered into by the major metropolitan zoos. 412

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 413
receives pursuant to section 4503.75 of the Revised Code to the 414
rotary foundation, located on March 31, 2003, in Evanston, 415
Illinois, to be placed in a fund known as the permanent fund and 416
used to endow educational and humanitarian programs of the 417
rotary foundation. 418

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 419
receives pursuant to section 4503.751 of the Revised Code to the 420
Ohio association of realtors, which shall deposit the 421
contributions into a property disaster relief fund maintained 422
under the Ohio realtors charitable and education foundation. 423

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 424
receives pursuant to section 4503.752 of the Revised Code to 425
buckeye corvettes, incorporated, which shall use the 426
contributions to pay for its charitable activities and programs. 427

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 428
receives pursuant to section 4503.763 of the Revised Code to the 429
Ohio history connection to be used solely to build, support, and 430

maintain the Ohio battleflag collection within the Ohio history 431
connection. 432

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 433
receives pursuant to section 4503.764 of the Revised Code to the 434
Medina county historical society, which shall use those 435
contributions to distribute between the various historical 436
societies and museums in Medina county. 437

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 438
receives pursuant to section 4503.765 of the Revised Code to the 439
Amaranth grand chapter foundation, which shall use the 440
contributions for communal outreach, charitable service, and 441
scholarship purposes. 442

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 443
receives pursuant to section 4503.85 of the Revised Code to the 444
Ohio sea grant college program to be used for Lake Erie area 445
research projects. 446

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 447
receives pursuant to section 4503.86 of the Revised Code to the 448
Ohio Lincoln highway historic byway, which shall use those 449
contributions solely to promote and support the historical 450
preservation and advertisement of the Lincoln highway in this 451
state. 452

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 453
receives pursuant to section 4503.87 of the Revised Code to the 454
Grove City little league dream field fund, which shall use those 455
contributions solely to build, maintain, and improve youth 456
baseball fields within the municipal corporation of Grove City. 457

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 458
receives pursuant to section 4503.871 of the Revised Code to the 459

Solon city school district. The school district shall use the 460
contributions it receives to pay the expenses it incurs in 461
providing services to the school district's students that assist 462
in developing or maintaining the mental and emotional well-being 463
of the students. The services provided may include bereavement 464
counseling, instruction in defensive driving techniques, 465
sensitivity training, and the counseling and education of 466
students regarding bullying, dating violence, drug abuse, 467
suicide prevention, and human trafficking. The school district 468
superintendent or, in the school district superintendent's 469
discretion, the appropriate school principal or appropriate 470
school counselors shall determine any charitable organizations 471
that the school district hires to provide those services. The 472
school district also may use the contributions it receives to 473
pay for members of the faculty of the school district to receive 474
training in providing such services to the students of the 475
school district. The school district shall ensure that any 476
charitable organization that is hired by the district is exempt 477
from federal income taxation under subsection 501(c)(3) of the 478
Internal Revenue Code. The school district shall not use the 479
contributions it receives for any other purpose. 480

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 481
receives pursuant to section 4503.872 of the Revised Code to the 482
Canton city school district. The district may use the 483
contributions for student welfare, but shall not use the 484
contributions for any political purpose or to pay salaries of 485
district employees. 486

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 487
receives pursuant to section 4503.873 of the Revised Code to 488
Padua Franciscan high school located in the municipal 489
corporation of Parma. The school shall use fifty per cent of the 490

contributions it receives to provide tuition assistance to its 491
students. The school shall use the remaining fifty per cent to 492
pay the expenses it incurs in providing services to the school's 493
students that assist in developing or maintaining the mental and 494
emotional well-being of the students. The services provided may 495
include bereavement counseling, instruction in defensive driving 496
techniques, sensitivity training, and the counseling and 497

may be combined with a request for a special reserved license 934

contribution fund created in section 4501.21 of the Revised 967
Code. 968

(2) The registrar shall deposit the administrative fee of 969
ten dollars, the purpose of which is to compensate the bureau of 970
motor vehicles for additional services required in the issuing 971
of "A Kid Again" license plates, into the state treasury to the 972
credit of the public safety - highway purposes fund created in 973
section 4501.06 of the Revised Code. 974
