- 16 (a) The legislative body of a municipality may provide that violations of ordinances and resolutions authorized by this division are punishable as misdemeanors.

4 5	(c) Sections 7–504 and 7–505 of the Courts Article shall govern imprisonment in default of fines and costs.

7 8 9	(a) (1) Unless State law classifies a violation as a criminal offense, the legislative body of a municipality may provide, by law, that a violation of a municipal ordinance is a municipal infraction.
10	(2) A municipal infraction is a civil offense.
11	(b) The legislative body of a municipality may classify as a municipal infraction:
12 13	(1) a violation of an ordinance or regulation concerning zoning or land uses
14 15	(2) littering in the municipality as prohibited under § 10–110 of the Criminal Law Article.
16 17	(c) (1) A fine not exceeding [\$1,000] \$5,000 may be imposed for each municipal infraction.
18 19	(2) The fine is payable to the municipality by the person charged in the citation within 20 calendar days of service of the citation.
20 21	SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect October 1, 2025.
