4	SYNOPSIS:
5	Under existing law, each law enforcement agency
6	is required to report certain civil asset forfeiture
7	information to the uniform crime reporting system
8	operated by the Alabama Justice Information Commission.
9	This bill would provide a penalty for a failure
10	to report and would further provide for the
11	requirements of what must be officially published by
12	the commission.

16	TO BE ENTITLED
17	AN ACT

19	Relating to civil asset forfeiture; to amend Section
20	41-9-655.01 and $41-9-655.03$, Code of Alabama 1975, to further
21	provide for civil asset forfeiture data reporting; to provide
22	a penalty for a violation; and to further provide for the
23	publishing of data on seizures and forfeitures.
24	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:
25	Section 1. Sections 41-9-655.01 and 41-9-655.03, Code
26	of Alabama 1975, are amended to read as follows:
27	" §41-9-655.01
28	(a) All property seized by a state, county, or



- 29 municipal law enforcement agency for forfeiture in connection
- 30 with a criminal event shall be reported to the uniform crime
- 31 reporting system operated by the Alabama State Law Enforcement
- 32 Agency on behalf of the Alabama Justice Information
- 33 Commission.
- 34 (b) The commission shall develop adopt rules for
- 35 reporting property seized pursuant to this section.
- 36 Information reported shall include any information required by
- 37 the commission, including, but not limited to, all of the
- 38 following:
- 39 (1) The date of the seizure.
- 40 (2) The address of the seizure.
- 41 (3) The name of the law enforcement agency that
- 42 conducted the seizure.
- 43 (4) The type of property seized.
- 44 (5) A general description of the property seized.
- 45 (6) The name of the person or entity, if known, from
- 46 whom the property was seized.
- 47 (7) A description of the suspected underlying criminal
- 48 activity that led to the seizure.
- 49 (8) Any known arrest, including the date and charge,
- 50 related to the seizure which occurred prior to a forfeiture
- final judgment of the seized property.
- 52 (9) Any and all civil case action numbers assigned in
- 53 state court.
- 54 (10) Any known claimants, including title holders of
- 55 record or lien holders of record.
- 56 (11) The disposition of the seized property, including



57 the date of any order.

- (12) The name of each entity receiving all or any portion of the seized property subject to the forfeiture disposition. If the forfeiture order requires the selling of the property, all proceeds from the sale shall be accounted for by the recipient.
- (c) The commission shall establish rules for the reporting of property seized in connection with a federal seizure in which seized property is forfeited in federal court to a state, county, or municipal law enforcement agency or when a law enforcement agency receives proceeds from a sale of forfeited property.
- (d) The commission shall establish restrictions and protections on forfeiture reporting consistent with the sensitivity placed on uniform crime reports through its authority under Section 41-9-594.
- (e) (1) If a law enforcement agency fails to report all of the information required under subsection (b), the commission shall give notice to the law enforcement agency of its noncompliance.
- (2) If the violation is not remedied within 14 calendar days of the giving of notice under subdivision (1), the commission may petition for injunctive and other equitable relief in the circuit court of the county in which the law enforcement agency is located to compel compliance under this section.
- 83 (3) Upon a finding that a law enforcement agency has
 84 violated this section and not remedied the violation as



85	provided in subdivision (2), the court shall order the law
86	enforcement agency to do all of the following:
87	(1) Comply with this section.
88	(2) Remit all monies paid to the law enforcement agency
89	pursuant to Section 20-2-93(s) to the State Treasurer to the
90	credit of the General Fund.
91	(3) Pay to the commission all reasonable attorney fees
92	and other costs incurred in the proceeding."

94	(a) $\frac{(1)}{(1)}$ Annually, on or before February 1, the Alabama
95	Justice Information Commission, shall submit to the Speaker of
96	the House of Representatives, President Pro Tempore of the
97	Senate, and Governor a written report that includes all of the
98	following:
99	$\frac{a_{-}(1)}{2}$ A summary of seizure and forfeiture activity in
100	the state for the preceding fiscal year.
101	$\frac{b.}{(2)}$ The type, approximate value, and disposition of
102	the property seized and forfeited.
103	$\frac{c}{c}$ The amount of any proceeds received.
104	(2)(b) The summary for data on seizures and forfeitures
105	<pre>may shall be disaggregated by the commission. The aggregate</pre>
106	disaggregated report shall also be made available on the
107	website of the Alabama Justice Information Commission
108	consistent with the format of other reports posted on the
109	<pre>commission's website. and shall contain all of the following:</pre>
110	(1) The date of the seizure.
111	(2) The address of the seizure.
112	(3) The name of the law enforcement agency that



113	conducted the seizure.
114	(4) The type of property seized.
115	(5) A general description of the property seized.
116	(6) The name of the individual or entity, if known,
117	from whom the property was seized.
118	(7) A description of the suspected underlying criminal
119	activity that led to the seizure.
120	(8) Any known arrest, including the date and charge,
121	related to the seizure which occurred prior to a forfeiture
122	final judgment of the seized property.
123	(9) Any and all civil case action numbers assigned in
124	state court.
125	(10) Any known claimants, including title holders of
126	record or lien holders of record, of the seized property.
127	(11) The disposition of the seized property, including
128	the date of any order.
129	(12) The name of each entity receiving all or any
130	portion of the seized property subject to the forfeiture
131	disposition. If the forfeiture order requires the selling of
132	the property, all proceeds from the sale shall be accounted
133	for by the recipient.
134	(b)(c) The Alabama Justice Information Commission may
135	include in the report required under subsection (a) this
136	<pre>section recommendations to improve laws, rules, and policies</pre>
137	to better ensure that seizure, forfeiture, and expenditures
138	are done and reported in a manner that is fair to crime
139	victims, innocent property owners, secured interest holders,
140	citizens, law enforcement, and taxpayers."



Section 2. This act shall become effective on October 142 1, 2025.
