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**A BILL**

To amend section 4501.21 and to enact section 1  
4503.959 of the Revised Code to create the Jesup 2  
W. Scott High School license plate. 3

**BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF OHIO:**

**Section 1.** That section 4501.21 be amended and section 4  
4503.959 of the Revised Code be enacted to read as follows: 5

**Sec. 4501.21.** (A) There is hereby created in the state 6  
treasury the license plate contribution fund. The fund shall 7  
consist of all contributions for specialty license plates paid 8  
by motor vehicle registrants and collected by the registrar of 9  
motor vehicles pursuant to the Revised Code sections referenced 10  
in division (B) of this section. 11

(B) The registrar shall pay the contributions the 12  
registrar collects in the fund as follows: 13

The registrar shall pay the contributions received 14  
pursuant to section 4503.491 of the Revised Code to the breast 15  
cancer fund of Ohio, which shall use that money only to pay for 16

programs that provide assistance and education to Ohio breast 17  
cancer patients and that improve access for such patients to 18  
quality health care and clinical trials and shall not use any of 19  
the money for abortion information, counseling, services, or 20  
other abortion-related activities. 21

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 22  
receives pursuant to section 4503.492 of the Revised Code to the 23  
organization cancer support community central Ohio, which shall 24  
deposit the money into the Sheryl L. Kraner Fund of that 25  
organization. Cancer support community central Ohio shall expend 26  
the money it receives pursuant to this division only in the same 27  
manner and for the same purposes as that organization expends 28  
other money in that fund. 29

The registrar shall pay the contributions received 30  
pursuant to section 4503.493 of the Revised Code to the autism 31  
society of Ohio, which shall use the contributions for programs 32  
and autism awareness efforts throughout the state. 33

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 34  
receives pursuant to section 4503.494 of the Revised Code to the 35  
national multiple sclerosis society for distribution in equal 36  
amounts to the northwestern Ohio, Ohio buckeye, and Ohio valley 37  
chapters of the national multiple sclerosis society. These 38  
chapters shall use the money they receive under this section to 39  
assist in paying the expenses they incur in providing services 40  
directly to their clients. 41

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 42  
receives pursuant to section 4503.495 of the Revised Code to the 43  
national pancreatic cancer foundation, which shall use the money 44  
it receives under this section to assist those who have 45  
pancreatic cancer and their families. 46

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.496 of the Revised Code to the Ohio sickle cell and health association, which shall use the contributions to help support educational, clinical, and social support services for adults who have sickle cell disease.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.497 of the Revised Code to the St. Baldrick's foundation, which shall use the contributions for its research and other programs.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.498 of the Revised Code to special olympics Ohio, inc., which shall use the contributions for its programs, charitable efforts, and other activities.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.499 of the Revised Code to the children's glioma cancer foundation, which shall use the contributions for its research and other programs.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.4910 of the Revised Code to the KylerStrong foundation, which shall use the contributions to raise awareness of brain cancer caused by diffuse intrinsic pontine glioma and to fund research for the cure of such cancer.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.4911 of the Revised Code to the research institution for childhood cancer at nationwide children's hospital, which shall use the contributions to fund research for the cure of childhood cancers.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.50 of the Revised Code to the

future farmers of America foundation, which shall deposit the 76  
contributions into its general account to be used for 77  
educational and scholarship purposes of the future farmers of 78  
America foundation. 79

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 80  
receives pursuant to section 4503.501 of the Revised Code to the 81  
4-H youth development program of the Ohio state university 82  
extension program, which shall use those contributions to pay 83  
the expenses it incurs in conducting its educational activities. 84

The registrar shall pay the contributions received 85  
pursuant to section 4503.502 of the Revised Code to the Ohio 86  
cattlemen's foundation, which shall use those contributions for 87  
scholarships and other educational activities. 88

The registrar shall pay the contributions received 89  
pursuant to section 4503.505 of the Revised Code to the 90  
organization Ohio region phi theta kappa, which shall use those 91  
contributions for scholarships for students who are members of 92  
that organization. 93

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 94  
receives pursuant to section 4503.506 of the Revised Code to 95  
Ohio demolay, which shall use the contributions for 96  
scholarships, educational programs, and any other programs or 97  
events the organization holds or sponsors in this state. 98

The registrar shall pay the contributions received 99  
pursuant to section 4503.507 of the Revised Code to the Ohio 100  
aerospace institute, which shall use those contributions to 101  
facilitate student internships in aerospace and educational 102  
programming. 103

The registrar shall pay the contributions received 104

pursuant to section 4503.508 of the Revised Code to the 105  
organization bottoms up diaper drive to provide funding for that 106  
organization for collecting and delivering diapers to parents in 107  
need. 108

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 109  
receives pursuant to section 4503.509 of the Revised Code to a 110  
kid again, incorporated for distribution in equal amounts to the 111  
Ohio chapters of a kid again. 112

The registrar shall pay each contribution the registrar 113  
receives pursuant to section 4503.51 of the Revised Code to the 114  
university or college whose name or marking or design appears on 115  
collegiate license plates that are issued to a person under that 116  
section. A university or college that receives contributions 117  
from the fund shall deposit the contributions into its general 118  
scholarship fund. 119

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 120  
receives pursuant to section 4503.514 of the Revised Code to the 121  
university of Notre Dame in South Bend, Indiana, for purposes of 122  
awarding grants or scholarships to residents of Ohio who attend 123  
the university. The university shall not use any of the funds it 124  
receives for purposes of administering the scholarship program. 125  
The registrar shall enter into appropriate agreements with the 126  
university of Notre Dame to effectuate the distribution of such 127  
funds as provided in this section. 128

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 129  
receives pursuant to section 4503.516 of the Revised Code to 130  
Marshall university in Huntington, West Virginia, for purposes 131  
of awarding grants or scholarships to residents of Ohio who 132  
attend the university. The university shall not use any of the 133  
funds it receives for purposes of administering the scholarship 134

program. The registrar shall enter into appropriate agreements 135  
with Marshall university to effectuate the distribution of such 136  
funds as provided in this section. 137

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 138  
receives pursuant to section 4503.517 of the Revised Code to the 139  
university of Alabama in Tuscaloosa, Alabama, for purposes of 140  
awarding grants or scholarships to residents of Ohio who attend 141  
the university. The university shall not use any of the funds it 142  
receives for purposes of administering the scholarship program. 143  
The registrar shall enter into appropriate agreements with the 144  
university of Alabama to effectuate the distribution of such 145  
funds as provided in this section. 146

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 147  
receives pursuant to section 4503.518 of the Revised Code to the 148  
Nationwide children's hospital, which shall use the 149  
contributions for the "On Our Sleeves" campaign. 150

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 151  
receives pursuant to section 4503.519 of the Revised Code 152  
equally to NAMI Ohio (national alliance on mental illness of 153  
Ohio), Ohio peer recovery organizations, and OCAAR (Ohio citizen 154  
advocates for addiction recovery). 155

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 156  
receives pursuant to section 4503.521 of the Revised Code to the 157  
Ohio bicycle federation to assist that organization in paying 158  
for the educational programs it sponsors in support of Ohio 159  
cyclists of all ages. 160

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 161  
receives pursuant to section 4503.522 of the Revised Code to the 162  
"friends of Perry's victory and international peace memorial, 163

incorporated," a nonprofit corporation organized under the laws 164  
of this state, to assist that organization in paying the 165  
expenses it incurs in sponsoring or holding charitable, 166  
educational, and cultural events at the monument. 167

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 168  
receives pursuant to section 4503.523 of the Revised Code to the 169  
fairport lights foundation, which shall use the money to pay for 170  
the restoration, maintenance, and preservation of the 171  
lighthouses of fairport harbor. 172

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 173  
receives pursuant to section 4503.524 of the Revised Code to the 174  
Massillon tiger football booster club, which shall use the 175  
contributions only to promote and support the football team of 176  
Washington high school of the Massillon city school district. 177

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 178  
receives pursuant to section 4503.525 of the Revised Code to the 179  
United States power squadron district seven which shall annually 180  
distribute the contributions in equal amounts to all United 181  
States power squadrons located in the state. Each power squadron 182  
district shall use the money it receives under this section to 183  
pay for the educational boating programs each district holds or 184  
sponsors within this state. 185

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 186  
receives pursuant to section 4503.526 of the Revised Code to the 187  
Ohio district Kiwanis foundation of the Ohio district of Kiwanis 188  
international, which shall use the money it receives under this 189  
section to pay the costs of its educational and humanitarian 190  
activities. 191

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 192

receives pursuant to section 4503.528 of the Revised Code to the 193  
Ohio children's alliance, which shall use the money it receives 194  
under this section to pay the expenses it incurs in advancing 195  
its mission of sustainably improving the provision of services 196  
to children, young adults, and families in this state. 197

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 198  
receives pursuant to section 4503.529 of the Revised Code to the 199  
Ohio nurses foundation. The foundation shall use the money it 200  
receives under this section to provide educational scholarships 201  
to assist individuals who aspire to join the nursing profession, 202  
to assist nurses in the nursing profession who seek to advance 203  
their education, and to support persons conducting nursing 204  
research concerning the evidence-based practice of nursing and 205  
the improvement of patient outcomes. 206

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 207  
receives pursuant to section 4503.531 of the Revised Code to the 208  
thank you foundation, incorporated, a nonprofit corporation 209  
organized under the laws of this state, to assist that 210  
organization in paying for the charitable activities and 211  
programs it sponsors in support of United States military 212  
personnel, veterans, and their families. 213

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 214  
receives pursuant to section 4503.532 of the Revised Code to the 215  
Ohio history connection, which shall use the contributions for 216  
the benefit of the Paul Laurence Dunbar house. 217

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 218  
receives pursuant to section 4503.533 of the Revised Code to the 219  
nonprofit organization Ohio conference of teamsters and industry 220  
health and welfare fund, which shall use the contributions to 221  
further the nonprofit's mission. 222



The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.534 of the Revised Code to the disabled American veterans department of Ohio, to be used for programs that serve disabled American veterans and their families.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.55 of the Revised Code to the pro football hall of fame, which shall deposit the contributions into a special bank account that it establishes and which shall be separate and distinct from any other account the pro football hall of fame maintains, to be used exclusively for the purpose of promoting the pro football hall of fame as a travel destination.

The registrar shall pay the contributions that are paid to the registrar pursuant to section 4503.545 of the Revised Code to the national rifle association foundation, which shall use the money to pay the costs of the educational activities and programs the foundation holds or sponsors in this state.

The registrar shall pay to the Ohio pet fund the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.551 of the Revised Code and any other money from any other source, including donations, gifts, and grants, that is designated by the source to be paid to the Ohio pet fund. The Ohio pet fund shall use the moneys it receives under this section to support programs for the sterilization of dogs and cats and for educational programs concerning the proper veterinary care of those animals, and for expenses of the Ohio pet fund that are reasonably necessary for it to obtain and maintain its tax-exempt status and to perform its duties.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar

receives pursuant to section 4503.552 of the Revised Code to the 253  
rock and roll hall of fame and museum, incorporated. 254

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 255  
receives pursuant to section 4503.553 of the Revised Code to the 256  
Ohio coalition for animals, incorporated, a nonprofit 257  
corporation. Except as provided in division (B) of this section, 258  
the coalition shall distribute the money to its members, and the 259  
members shall use the money only to pay for educational, 260  
charitable, and other programs of each coalition member that 261  
provide care for unwanted, abused, and neglected horses. The 262  
Ohio coalition for animals may use a portion of the money to pay 263  
for reasonable marketing costs incurred in the design and 264  
promotion of the license plate and for administrative costs 265  
incurred in the disbursement and management of funds received 266  
under this section. 267

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 268  
receives pursuant to section 4503.554 of the Revised Code to the 269  
Ohio state council of the knights of Columbus, which shall use 270  
the contributions to pay for its charitable activities and 271  
programs. 272

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 273  
receives pursuant to section 4503.555 of the Revised Code to the 274  
western reserve historical society, which shall use the 275  
contributions to fund the Crawford auto aviation museum. 276

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 277  
receives pursuant to section 4503.556 of the Revised Code to the 278  
Erica J. Holloman foundation, inc., for the awareness of triple 279  
negative breast cancer. The foundation shall use the 280  
contributions for charitable and educational purposes. 281

The registrar shall pay each contribution the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.557 of the Revised Code to the central Ohio chapter of the Ronald McDonald house charities, which shall distribute the contribution to the chapter of the Ronald McDonald house charities in whose geographic territory the person who paid the contribution resides.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.559 of the Revised Code to playhouse square, located in Cleveland, Ohio, which shall use the contributions to further its mission of presenting and producing a wide variety of quality performing arts, advancing arts education, and creating a superior destination for entertainment, business, and residential living.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.561 of the Revised Code to the state of Ohio chapter of ducks unlimited, inc., which shall deposit the contributions into a special bank account that it establishes. The special bank account shall be separate and distinct from any other account the state of Ohio chapter of ducks unlimited, inc., maintains and shall be used exclusively for the purpose of protecting, enhancing, restoring, and managing wetlands and conserving wildlife habitat. The state of Ohio chapter of ducks unlimited, inc., annually shall notify the registrar in writing of the name, address, and account to which such payments are to be made.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.562 of the Revised Code to the Mahoning river consortium, which shall use the money to pay the expenses it incurs in restoring and maintaining the Mahoning river watershed.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 312  
receives pursuant to section 4503.564 of the Revised Code to the 313  
Glen Helen association to pay expenses related to the Glen Helen 314  
nature preserve. 315

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 316  
receives pursuant to section 4503.565 of the Revised Code to the 317  
conservancy for Cuyahoga valley national park, which shall use 318  
the money in support of the park. 319

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 320  
receives pursuant to section 4503.566 of the Revised Code to the 321  
Ottawa national wildlife refuge, which shall use the 322  
contributions for wildlife preservation purposes. 323

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 324  
receives pursuant to section 4503.567 of the Revised Code to the 325  
girls on the run of Franklin county, inc., which shall use the 326  
contributions to support the activities of the organization. 327

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 328  
receives pursuant to section 4503.569 of the Revised Code to the 329  
Ohio bird sanctuary, located in Mansfield, Ohio, which shall use 330  
the contributions for purposes of its operations, bird care and 331  
rehabilitation, and educational programs. 332

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 333  
receives pursuant to section 4503.576 of the Revised Code to the 334  
Ohio state beekeepers association, which shall use those 335  
contributions to promote beekeeping, provide educational 336  
information about beekeeping, and to support other state and 337  
local beekeeping programs. 338

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 339  
receives pursuant to section 4503.577 of the Revised Code to the 340

national aviation hall of fame, which shall use the 341  
contributions to fulfill its mission of honoring aerospace 342  
legends to inspire future leaders. 343

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 344  
receives pursuant to section 4503.578 of the Revised Code to 345  
keep Ohio beautiful, incorporated, which shall use the 346  
contributions towards its mission of empowering Ohio communities 347  
to take greater responsibility for improving the local 348  
environment through litter prevention, beautification, community 349  
greening, waste reduction, and recycling. 350

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 351  
receives pursuant to section 4503.579 of the Revised Code to the 352  
national council of negro women, incorporated, which shall use 353  
the contributions for educational purposes. 354

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 355  
receives pursuant to section 4503.581 of the Revised Code to the 356  
Ohio past detachment commander's club, inc., which shall use the 357  
contributions to support the activities of the organization. 358

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 359  
receives pursuant to section 4503.582 of the Revised Code to the 360  
progressive animal welfare society adoption center, inc., which 361  
shall use the contributions to support the activities of the 362  
center. 363

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 364  
receives pursuant to section 4503.583 of the Revised Code to the 365  
American legion, department of Ohio, inc., which shall use the 366  
contributions to support the activities of the organization. 367

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 368  
receives pursuant to section 4503.584 of the Revised Code to the 369

Ohio oil and gas energy education foundation to fund 370  
scholarships for students pursuing careers in the oil and 371  
natural gas industry. 372

The registrar shall pay to a sports commission created 373  
pursuant to section 4503.591 of the Revised Code each 374  
contribution the registrar receives under that section that an 375  
applicant pays to obtain license plates that bear the logo of a 376  
professional sports team located in the county of that sports 377  
commission and that is participating in the license plate 378  
program pursuant to division (E) of that section, irrespective 379  
of the county of residence of an applicant. 380

The registrar shall pay to a community charity each 381  
contribution the registrar receives under section 4503.591 of 382  
the Revised Code that an applicant pays to obtain license plates 383  
that bear the logo of a professional sports team that is 384  
participating in the license plate program pursuant to division 385  
(G) of that section. 386

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 387  
receives pursuant to section 4503.592 of the Revised Code to 388  
pollinator partnership's monarch wings across Ohio program, 389  
which shall use the contributions for the protection and 390  
preservation of the monarch butterfly and pollinator corridor in 391  
Ohio and for educational programs. 392

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 393  
receives pursuant to section 4503.594 of the Revised Code to 394  
pelotonia, which shall use the contributions for the purpose of 395  
supporting cancer research. 396

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 397  
receives pursuant to section 4503.595 of the Revised Code to the 398

Stan Hywet hall and gardens. 399

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 400  
receives pursuant to section 4503.596 of the Revised Code to the 401  
Cuyahoga valley scenic railroad. 402

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 403  
receives pursuant to section 4503.597 of the Revised Code to the 404  
Circleville pumpkin show, incorporated, which shall use the 405  
contributions to promote good will surrounding the Circleville 406  
pumpkin show as a nonprofit annual event. 407

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 408  
receives pursuant to section 4503.67 of the Revised Code to the 409  
Dan Beard council of the boy scouts of America. The council 410  
shall distribute all contributions in an equitable manner 411  
throughout the state to regional councils of the boy scouts. 412

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 413  
receives pursuant to section 4503.68 of the Revised Code to the 414  
girl scouts of Ohio's heartland. The girl scouts of Ohio's 415  
heartland shall distribute all contributions in an equitable 416  
manner throughout the state to regional councils of the girl 417  
scouts. 418

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 419  
receives pursuant to section 4503.69 of the Revised Code to the 420  
Dan Beard council of the boy scouts of America. The council 421  
shall distribute all contributions in an equitable manner 422  
throughout the state to regional councils of the boy scouts. 423

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 424  
receives pursuant to section 4503.70 of the Revised Code to the 425  
charitable foundation of the grand lodge of Ohio, f. & a. m., 426  
which shall use the contributions for scholarship purposes. 427

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 428  
receives pursuant to section 4503.701 of the Revised Code to the 429  
Prince Hall grand lodge of free and accepted masons of Ohio, 430  
which shall use the contributions for scholarship purposes. 431

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 432  
receives pursuant to section 4503.702 of the Revised Code to the 433  
Ohio Association of the Improved Benevolent and Protective Order 434  
of the Elks of the World, which shall use the funds for 435  
charitable purposes. 436

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 437  
receives pursuant to section 4503.703 of the Revised Code to the 438  
Ohio chapter of the loyal order of the moose. 439

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 440  
receives pursuant to section 4503.704 of the Revised Code to the 441  
Antioch shrine foundation located in the municipal corporation 442  
of Dayton. 443

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 444  
receives pursuant to section 4503.71 of the Revised Code to the 445  
fraternal order of police of Ohio, incorporated, which shall 446  
deposit the fees into its general account to be used for 447  
purposes of the fraternal order of police of Ohio, incorporated. 448

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 449  
receives pursuant to section 4503.711 of the Revised Code to the 450  
fraternal order of police of Ohio, incorporated, which shall 451  
deposit the contributions into an account that it creates to be 452  
used for the purpose of advancing and protecting the law 453  
enforcement profession, promoting improved law enforcement 454  
methods, and teaching respect for law and order. 455

The registrar shall pay the contributions received 456



pursuant to section 4503.712 of the Revised Code to Ohio 457  
concerns of police survivors, which shall use those 458  
contributions to provide whatever assistance may be appropriate 459  
to the families of Ohio law enforcement officers who are killed 460  
in the line of duty. 461

The registrar shall pay the contributions received 462  
pursuant to section 4503.713 of the Revised Code to the greater 463  
Cleveland peace officers memorial society, which shall use those 464  
contributions to honor law enforcement officers who have died in 465  
the line of duty and support its charitable purposes. 466

The registrar shall pay the contributions received 467  
pursuant to section 4503.714 of the Revised Code to the Ohio 468  
association of chiefs of police. 469

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 470  
receives, or has received, pursuant to section 4503.715 of the 471  
Revised Code to the community foundation of Ohio's electric 472  
cooperatives, which shall use the contributions to recognize and 473  
memorialize fallen or injured lineworkers and support their 474  
families. 475

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 476  
receives pursuant to section 4503.716 of the Revised Code to the 477  
fallen timbers battlefield preservation commission, which shall 478  
use the contributions to further the mission of the commission. 479

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 480  
receives pursuant to section 4503.72 of the Revised Code to the 481  
organization known on March 31, 2003, as the Ohio CASA/GAL 482  
association, a private, nonprofit corporation organized under 483  
Chapter 1702. of the Revised Code. The Ohio CASA/GAL association 484  
shall use these contributions to pay the expenses it incurs in 485

administering a program to secure the proper representation in 486  
the courts of this state of abused, neglected, and dependent 487  
children, and for the training and supervision of persons 488  
participating in that program. 489

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 490  
receives pursuant to section 4503.722 of the Revised Code to the 491  
Down Syndrome Association of Central Ohio, which shall use the 492

receives pursuant to section 4503.933 of the Revised Code to 1000  
Ohio citizens for the arts foundation, which shall use the 1001  
contributions for advocacy, education, and professional 1002  
development programs. 1003

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 1004  
receives pursuant to section 4503.94 of the Revised Code to the 1005  
Michelle's leading star foundation, which shall use the money 1006  
solely to fund the rental, lease, or purchase of the simulated 1007  
driving curriculum of the Michelle's leading star foundation by 1008  
boards of education of city, exempted village, local, and joint 1009  
vocational school districts. 1010

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 1011  
receives pursuant to section 4503.941 of the Revised Code to the 1012  
Ohio chapter international society of arboriculture, which shall 1013  
use the money to increase consumer awareness on the importance 1014  
of proper tree care and to raise funds for the chapter's 1015  
educational efforts. 1016

The registrar shall pay the contributions received 1017  
pursuant to section 4503.942 of the Revised Code to zero, the 1018  
end of prostate cancer, incorporated, a nonprofit organization, 1019  
which shall use those contributions to raise awareness of 1020  
prostate cancer, to support research to end prostate cancer, and 1021  
to support prostate cancer patients and their families. 1022

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 1023  
receives pursuant to section 4503.944 of the Revised Code to the 1024  
eastern European congress of Ohio, which shall use the 1025

contributions for charitable and educational purposes. 1026

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 1027  
receives pursuant to section 4503.945 of the Revised Code to the 1028  
Summit metro parks foundation, which shall use the money in 1029  
support of the Summit county metro parks. 1030

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 1031  
receives pursuant to section 4503.951 of the Revised Code to the 1032  
Cincinnati city school district. 1033

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 1034  
receives pursuant to section 4503.952 of the Revised Code to 1035  
Hawken school located in northeast Ohio. The school shall use 1036  
fifty per cent of the contributions it receives to provide 1037  
tuition assistance to its students. The school shall use the 1038  
remaining fifty per cent to pay the expenses it incurs in 1039  
providing services to the school's students that assist in 1040  
developing or maintaining the mental and emotional well-being of 1041  
the students. The services provided may include bereavement 1042  
counseling, instruction in defensive driving techniques, 1043  
sensitivity training, and the counseling and education of 1044  
students regarding bullying, dating violence, drug abuse, 1045  
suicide prevention, and human trafficking. As a part of 1046  
providing such services, the school may pay for members of the 1047

receives pursuant to section 4503.958 of the Revised Code to 1137  
Elder high school located in the municipal corporation of 1138  
Cincinnati. The school shall use fifty per cent of the 1139  
contributions it receives to provide tuition assistance to its 1140  
students, twenty-five per cent of the contributions to benefit 1141  
arts and enrichment at the school, and twenty-five per cent of 1142  
the contributions to benefit athletics at the school. 1143

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 1144  
receives pursuant to section 4503.959 of the Revised Code to 1145  
Jesup W. Scott high school's principal activities fund. The high 1146  
school shall use the contributions to enhance learning 1147

opportunities for the high school's students. 1148

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 1149  
receives pursuant to section 4503.961 of the Revised Code to 1150  
Fairfield senior high school located in the municipal 1151  
corporation of Fairfield. The high school shall not use the 1152  
contributions for any political purpose. 1153

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 1154  
receives pursuant to section 4503.962 of the Revised Code to 1155  
Hamilton high school located in the municipal corporation of 1156  
Hamilton. The high school shall not use the contributions for 1157  
any political purpose. 1158

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 1159  
receives pursuant to section 4503.963 of the Revised Code to 1160  
Ross high school located in Ross township in Butler county. The 1161  
high school shall not use the contributions for any political 1162  
purpose. 1163

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 1164  
receives pursuant to section 4503.964 of the Revised Code to 1165  
Chardon hilltopper gridiron club. The club shall use 1166  
contributions to fund college and career technical training 1167  
scholarships for students. 1168

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 1169  
receives pursuant to section 4503.97 of the Revised Code to the 1170  
friends of united Hatzalah of Israel, which shall use the money 1171  
to support united Hatzalah of Israel, which provides free 1172  
emergency medical first response throughout Israel. 1173

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 1174  
receives pursuant to section 4503.98 of the Revised Code to the 1175  
Westerville parks foundation to support the programs and 1176



activities of the foundation and its mission of pursuing the 1177  
city of Westerville's vision of becoming "A City Within A Park." 1178

(C) All investment earnings of the license plate 1179  
contribution fund shall be credited to the fund. Not later than 1180  
the first day of May of every year, the registrar shall 1181  
distribute to each entity described in division (B) of this 1182  
section the investment income the fund earned the previous 1183  
calendar year. The amount of such a distribution paid to an 1184  
entity shall be proportionate to the amount of money the entity 1185  
received from the fund during the previous calendar year. 1186

Sec. 4503.959. (A) The owner or lessee of any passenger 1187  
car, noncommercial motor vehicle, recreational vehicle, or other 1188  
vehicle of a class approved by the registrar of motor vehicles 1189  
may apply to the registrar for the registration of the vehicle 1190  
and issuance of "Jesup W. Scott High School" license plates. The 1191  
application may be combined with a request for a special 1192  
reserved license plate under section 4503.40 or 4503.42 of the 1193  
Revised Code. Upon receipt of the completed application and 1194  
compliance by the applicant with divisions (B) and (C) of this 1195  
section, the registrar shall issue to the applicant the 1196  
appropriate vehicle registration and a set of "Jesup W. Scott 1197  
High School" license plates and a validation sticker, or a 1198  
validation sticker alone when required by section 4503.191 of 1199  
the Revised Code. 1200

In addition to the letters and numbers ordinarily 1201  
inscribed on the license plates, "Jesup W. Scott High School" 1202  
license plates shall display an appropriate logo and words that 1203  
are selected by representatives of Jesup. W. Scott high school 1204  
and approved by the registrar. "Jesup W. Scott High School" 1205  
license plates shall display county identification stickers that 1206

identify the county of registration as required under section 1207  
4503.19 of the Revised Code. 1208

(B) "Jesup W. Scott High School" license plates and a 1209  
validation sticker, or validation sticker alone, shall be issued 1210  
upon receipt of an application for registration of a motor 1211  
vehicle under this section; payment of the regular license tax 1212  
as prescribed under section 4503.04 of the Revised Code, any 1213  
applicable motor vehicle license tax levied under Chapter 4504. 1214  
of the Revised Code, any applicable additional fee prescribed by 1215  
section 4503.40 or 4503.42 of the Revised Code, an additional 1216  
administrative fee of ten dollars, and a contribution as 1217  
provided in division (C)(1) of this section; and compliance with 1218  
all other applicable laws relating to the registration of motor 1219  
vehicles. 1220

(C)(1) For each application for registration and 1221  
registration renewal notice the registrar receives under this 1222  
section, the registrar shall collect a contribution of ten 1223  
dollars. The registrar shall deposit this contribution into the 1224  
state treasury to the credit of the license plate contribution 1225  
fund created in section 4501.21 of the Revised Code. 1226

(2) The registrar shall deposit the administrative fee of 1227  
ten dollars, the purpose of which is to compensate the bureau of 1228  
motor vehicles for additional services required in the issuing 1229  
of "Jesup W. Scott High School" license plates, into the state 1230  
treasury to the credit of the public safety - highway purposes 1231  
fund created in section 4501.06 of the Revised Code. 1232

**Section 2.** That existing section 4501.21 of the Revised 1233  
Code is hereby repealed. 1234

**Section 3.** Section 4501.21 of the Revised Code is 1235

presented in this act as a composite of the section as amended 1236  
by H.B. 74, H.B. 110, H.B. 281, H.B. 291, and H.B. 578, all of 1237  
the 134th General Assembly. The General Assembly, applying the 1238  
principle stated in division (B) of section 1.52 of the Revised 1239  
Code that amendments are to be harmonized if reasonably capable 1240  
of simultaneous operation, finds that the composite is the 1241  
resulting version of the section in effect prior to the 1242  
effective date of the section as presented in this act. 1243
