A BILL

To amend the Richard B. Russell National School Lunch Act to allow schools that participate in the school lunch program to serve whole milk, and for other purposes.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
- 3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.
- 4 This Act may be cited as the "Whole Milk for
- 5 Healthy Kids Act of 2025".

1	SEC. 2. ORGANIC OR NON-ORGANIC WHOLE MILK PERMIS-
2	SIBLE.
3	Section 9(a)(2) of the Richard B. Russell National
4	School Lunch Act (42 U.S.C. 1758(a)(2)) is amended—
5	(1) in subparagraph (A)—
6	(A) by striking clauses (i) and (ii) and in-
7	serting the following:
8	"(i) shall offer students a variety of
9	fluid milk;
10	"(ii) may offer students flavored and
11	unflavored organic or nonorganic whole,
12	reduced-fat, low-fat, and fat-free fluid milk
13	and lactose-free fluid milk;"; and
14	(B) in clause (iii), by striking "physician"
15	and inserting "physician, parent, or legal
16	guardian"; and
17	(2) by adding at the end the following:
18	"(D) Saturated fat.—Milk fat included
19	in any fluid milk provided under subparagraph
20	(A) shall not be considered saturated fat for
21	purposes of measuring compliance with the al-
22	lowable average saturated fat content of a meal
23	under section 210.10 of title 7, Code of Federal
24	Regulations (or successor regulations).".
