A BILL

To amend section 4501.21 and to enact section 1
4503.519 of the Revised Code to create the 2
"Recovery is Beautiful" license plate. 3

BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF OHIO:

Section 1. That section 4501.21 be amended and section 4
4503.519 of the Revised Code be enacted to read as follows: 5

Sec. 4501.21. (A) There is hereby created in the state 6
treasury the license plate contribution fund. The fund shall 7
consist of all contributions for specialty license plates paid 8
by motor vehicle registrants and collected by the registrar of 9
motor vehicles pursuant to the Revised Code sections referenced 10
in division (B) of this section. 11

(B) The registrar shall pay the contributions the 12
registrar collects in the fund as follows: 13

The registrar shall pay the contributions received 14
pursuant to section 4503.491 of the Revised Code to the breast 15
cancer fund of Ohio, which shall use that money only to pay for 16
programs that provide assistance and education to Ohio breast 17

cancer patients and that improve access for such patients to 18
quality health care and clinical trials and shall not use any of 19
the money for abortion information, counseling, services, or 20
other abortion-related activities. 21

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 22
receives pursuant to section 4503.492 of the Revised Code to the 23
organization cancer support community central Ohio, which shall 24
deposit the money into the Sheryl L. Kraner Fund of that 25
organization. Cancer support community central Ohio shall expend 26
the money it receives pursuant to this division only in the same 27
manner and for the same purposes as that organization expends 28
other money in that fund. 29

The registrar shall pay the contributions received 30
pursuant to section 4503.493 of the Revised Code to the autism 31
society of Ohio, which shall use the contributions for programs 32
and autism awareness efforts throughout the state. 33

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 34
receives pursuant to section 4503.494 of the Revised Code to the 35
national multiple sclerosis society for distribution in equal 36
amounts to the northwestern Ohio, Ohio buckeye, and Ohio valley 37
chapters of the national multiple sclerosis society. These 38
chapters shall use the money they receive under this section to 39
assist in paying the expenses they incur in providing services 40
directly to their clients. 41

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 42
receives pursuant to section 4503.495 of the Revised Code to the 43
national pancreatic cancer foundation, which shall use the money 44
it receives under this section to assist those who suffer with 45
pancreatic cancer and their families. 46

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.496 of the Revised Code to the Ohio sickle cell and health association, which shall use the contributions to help support educational, clinical, and social support services for adults who have sickle cell disease.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.497 of the Revised Code to the St. Baldrick's foundation, which shall use the contributions for its research and other programs.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.498 of the Revised Code to special olympics Ohio, inc., which shall use the contributions for its programs, charitable efforts, and other activities.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.499 of the Revised Code to the children's glioma cancer foundation, which shall use the contributions for its research and other programs.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.4910 of the Revised Code to the KylerStrong foundation, which shall use the contributions to raise awareness of brain cancer caused by diffuse intrinsic pontine glioma and to fund research for the cure of such cancer.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.4911 of the Revised Code to the research institution for childhood cancer at nationwide children's hospital, which shall use the contributions to fund research for the cure of childhood cancers.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.50 of the Revised Code to the

future farmers of America foundation, which shall deposit the 76
contributions into its general account to be used for 77
educational and scholarship purposes of the future farmers of 78
America foundation. 79

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 80
receives pursuant to section 4503.501 of the Revised Code to the 81
4-H youth development program of the Ohio state university 82
extension program, which shall use those contributions to pay 83
the expenses it incurs in conducting its educational activities. 84

The registrar shall pay the contributions received 85
pursuant to section 4503.502 of the Revised Code to the Ohio 86
cattlemen's foundation, which shall use those contributions for 87
scholarships and other educational activities. 88

The registrar shall pay the contributions received 89
pursuant to section 4503.505 of the Revised Code to the 90
organization Ohio region phi theta kappa, which shall use those 91
contributions for scholarships for students who are members of 92
that organization. 93

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 94
receives pursuant to section 4503.506 of the Revised Code to 95
Ohio demolay, which shall use the contributions for 96
scholarships, educational programs, and any other programs or 97
events the organization holds or sponsors in this state. 98

The registrar shall pay the contributions received 99
pursuant to section 4503.508 of the Revised Code to the 100
organization bottoms up diaper drive to provide funding for that 101
organization for collecting and delivering diapers to parents in 102
need. 103

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 104

receives pursuant to section 4503.509 of the Revised Code to a 105
kid again, incorporated for distribution in equal amounts to the 106
Ohio chapters of a kid again. 107

The registrar shall pay each contribution the registrar 108
receives pursuant to section 4503.51 of the Revised Code to the 109
university or college whose name or marking or design appears on 110
collegiate license plates that are issued to a person under that 111
section. A university or college that receives contributions 112
from the fund shall deposit the contributions into its general 113
scholarship fund. 114

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 115
receives pursuant to section 4503.514 of the Revised Code to the 116
university of Notre Dame in South Bend, Indiana, for purposes of 117
awarding grants or scholarships to residents of Ohio who attend 118
the university. The university shall not use any of the funds it 119
receives for purposes of administering the scholarship program. 120
The registrar shall enter into appropriate agreements with the 121
university of Notre Dame to effectuate the distribution of such 122
funds as provided in this section. 123

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 124
receives pursuant to section 4503.519 of the Revised Code 125
equally to NAMI Ohio (national alliance on mental illness of 126
Ohio), Ohio peer recovery organizations, and OCAAR (Ohio citizen 127
advocates for addiction recovery). 128

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 129
receives pursuant to section 4503.521 of the Revised Code to the 130
Ohio bicycle federation to assist that organization in paying 131
for the educational programs it sponsors in support of Ohio 132
cyclists of all ages. 133

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.522 of the Revised Code to the "friends of Perry's victory and international peace memorial, incorporated," a nonprofit corporation organized under the laws of this state, to assist that organization in paying the expenses it incurs in sponsoring or holding charitable, educational, and cultural events at the monument.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.523 of the Revised Code to the fairport lights foundation, which shall use the money to pay for the restoration, maintenance, and preservation of the lighthouses of fairport harbor.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.524 of the Revised Code to the Massillon tiger football booster club, which shall use the contributions only to promote and support the football team of Washington high school of the Massillon city school district.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.525 of the Revised Code to the United States power squadron district seven which shall annually distribute the contributions in equal amounts to all United States power squadrons located in the state. Each power squadron district shall use the money it receives under this section to pay for the educational boating programs each district holds or sponsors within this state.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.526 of the Revised Code to the Ohio district Kiwanis foundation of the Ohio district of Kiwanis international, which shall use the money it receives under this section to pay the costs of its educational and humanitarian

activities. 164

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 165
receives pursuant to section 4503.528 of the Revised Code to the 166
Ohio children's alliance, which shall use the money it receives 167
under this section to pay the expenses it incurs in advancing 168
its mission of sustainably improving the provision of services 169
to children, young adults, and families in this state. 170

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 171
receives pursuant to section 4503.529 of the Revised Code to the 172
Ohio nurses foundation. The foundation shall use the money it 173
receives under this section to provide educational scholarships 174
to assist individuals who aspire to join the nursing profession, 175
to assist nurses in the nursing profession who seek to advance 176
their education, and to support persons conducting nursing 177
research concerning the evidence-based practice of nursing and 178
the improvement of patient outcomes. 179

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 180
receives pursuant to section 4503.531 of the Revised Code to the 181
thank you foundation, incorporated, a nonprofit corporation 182
organized under the laws of this state, to assist that 183
organization in paying for the charitable activities and 184
programs it sponsors in support of United States military 185
personnel, veterans, and their families. 186

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 187
receives pursuant to section 4503.534 of the Revised Code to the 188
disabled American veterans department of Ohio, to be used for 189
programs that serve disabled American veterans and their 190
families. 191

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 192

receives pursuant to section 4503.55 of the Revised Code to the 193
pro football hall of fame, which shall deposit the contributions 194
into a special bank account that it establishes and which shall 195
be separate and distinct from any other account the pro football 196
hall of fame maintains, to be used exclusively for the purpose 197
of promoting the pro football hall of fame as a travel 198
destination. 199

The registrar shall pay the contributions that are paid to 200
the registrar pursuant to section 4503.545 of the Revised Code 201
to the national rifle association foundation, which shall use 202
the money to pay the costs of the educational activities and 203
programs the foundation holds or sponsors in this state. 204

The registrar shall pay to the Ohio pet fund the 205
contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 206
4503.551 of the Revised Code and any other money from any other 207
source, including donations, gifts, and grants, that is 208
designated by the source to be paid to the Ohio pet fund. The 209
Ohio pet fund shall use the moneys it receives under this 210
section to support programs for the sterilization of dogs and 211
cats and for educational programs concerning the proper 212
veterinary care of those animals, and for expenses of the Ohio 213
pet fund that are reasonably necessary for it to obtain and 214
maintain its tax-exempt status and to perform its duties. 215

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 216
receives pursuant to section 4503.552 of the Revised Code to the 217
rock and roll hall of fame and museum, incorporated. 218

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 219
receives pursuant to section 4503.553 of the Revised Code to the 220
Ohio coalition for animals, incorporated, a nonprofit 221
corporation. Except as provided in division (B) of this section, 222

the coalition shall distribute the money to its members, and the 223
members shall use the money only to pay for educational, 224
charitable, and other programs of each coalition member that 225
provide care for unwanted, abused, and neglected horses. The 226
Ohio coalition for animals may use a portion of the money to pay 227
for reasonable marketing costs incurred in the design and 228
promotion of the license plate and for administrative costs 229
incurred in the disbursement and management of funds received 230
under this section. 231

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 232
receives pursuant to section 4503.554 of the Revised Code to the 233
Ohio state council of the knights of Columbus, which shall use 234
the contributions to pay for its charitable activities and 235
programs. 236

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 237
receives pursuant to section 4503.555 of the Revised Code to the 238
western reserve historical society, which shall use the 239
contributions to fund the Crawford auto aviation museum. 240

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 241
receives pursuant to section 4503.556 of the Revised Code to the 242
Erica J. Holloman foundation, inc., for the awareness of triple 243
negative breast cancer. The foundation shall use the 244
contributions for charitable and educational purposes. 245

The registrar shall pay each contribution the registrar 246
receives pursuant to section 4503.557 of the Revised Code to the 247
central Ohio chapter of the Ronald McDonald house charities, 248
which shall distribute the contribution to the chapter of the 249
Ronald McDonald house charities in whose geographic territory 250
the person who paid the contribution resides. 251

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 252
receives pursuant to section 4503.561 of the Revised Code to the 253
state of Ohio chapter of ducks unlimited, inc., which shall 254
deposit the contributions into a special bank account that it 255
establishes. The special bank account shall be separate and 256
distinct from any other account the state of Ohio chapter of 257
ducks unlimited, inc., maintains and shall be used exclusively 258
for the purpose of protecting, enhancing, restoring, and 259
managing wetlands and conserving wildlife habitat. The state of 260
Ohio chapter of ducks unlimited, inc., annually shall notify the 261
registrar in writing of the name, address, and account to which 262
such payments are to be made. 263

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 264
receives pursuant to section 4503.562 of the Revised Code to the 265
Mahoning river consortium, which shall use the money to pay the 266
expenses it incurs in restoring and maintaining the Mahoning 267
river watershed. 268

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 269
receives pursuant to section 4503.564 of the Revised Code to the 270
Glen Helen association to pay expenses related to the Glen Helen 271
nature preserve. 272

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 273
receives pursuant to section 4503.565 of the Revised Code to the 274
conservancy for Cuyahoga valley national park, which shall use 275
the money in support of the park. 276

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 277
receives pursuant to section 4503.566 of the Revised Code to the 278
Ottawa national wildlife refuge, which shall use the 279
contributions for wildlife preservation purposes. 280

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 281
receives pursuant to section 4503.567 of the Revised Code to the 282
girls on the run of Franklin county, inc., which shall use the 283
contributions to support the activities of the organization. 284

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 285
receives pursuant to section 4503.576 of the Revised Code to the 286
Ohio state beekeepers association, which shall use those 287
contributions to promote beekeeping, provide educational 288
information about beekeeping, and to support other state and 289
local beekeeping programs. 290

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 291
receives pursuant to section 4503.577 of the Revised Code to the 292
national aviation hall of fame, which shall use the 293
contributions to fulfill its mission of honoring aerospace 294
legends to inspire future leaders. 295

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 296
receives pursuant to section 4503.579 of the Revised Code to the 297
national council of negro women, incorporated, which shall use 298
the contributions for educational purposes. 299

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 300
receives pursuant to section 4503.581 of the Revised Code to the 301
Ohio sons of the American legion, which shall use the 302
contributions to support the activities of the organization. 303

The registrar shall pay to a sports commission created 304
pursuant to section 4503.591 of the Revised Code each 305
contribution the registrar receives under that section that an 306
applicant pays to obtain license plates that bear the logo of a 307
professional sports team located in the county of that sports 308
commission and that is participating in the license plate 309

program pursuant to division (E) of that section, irrespective 310
of the county of residence of an applicant. 311

The registrar shall pay to a community charity each 312
contribution the registrar receives under section 4503.591 of 313
the Revised Code that an applicant pays to obtain license plates 314
that bear the logo of a professional sports team that is 315
participating in the license plate program pursuant to division 316
(G) of that section. 317

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 318
receives pursuant to section 4503.592 of the Revised Code to 319
pollinator partnership's monarch wings across Ohio program, 320
which shall use the contributions for the protection and 321
preservation of the monarch butterfly and pollinator corridor in 322
Ohio and for educational programs. 323

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 324
receives pursuant to section 4503.594 of the Revised Code to 325
pelotonia, which shall use the contributions for the purpose of 326
supporting cancer research. 327

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 328
receives pursuant to section 4503.595 of the Revised Code to the 329
Stan Hywet hall and gardens. 330

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 331
receives pursuant to section 4503.596 of the Revised Code to the 332
Cuyahoga valley scenic railroad. 333

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 334
receives pursuant to section 4503.67 of the Revised Code to the 335
Dan Beard council of the boy scouts of America. The council 336
shall distribute all contributions in an equitable manner 337
throughout the state to regional councils of the boy scouts. 338

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 339
receives pursuant to section 4503.68 of the Revised Code to the 340
girl scouts of Ohio's heartland. The girl scouts of Ohio's 341
heartland shall distribute all contributions in an equitable 342
manner throughout the state to regional councils of the girl 343
scouts. 344

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 345
receives pursuant to section 4503.69 of the Revised Code to the 346
Dan Beard council of the boy scouts of America. The council 347
shall distribute all contributions in an equitable manner 348
throughout the state to regional councils of the boy scouts. 349

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 350
receives pursuant to section 4503.70 of the Revised Code to the 351
charitable foundation of the grand lodge of Ohio, f. & a. m., 352
which shall use the contributions for scholarship purposes. 353

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 354
receives pursuant to section 4503.701 of the Revised Code to the 355
Prince Hall grand lodge of free and accepted masons of Ohio, 356
which shall use the contributions for scholarship purposes. 357

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 358
receives pursuant to section 4503.702 of the Revised Code to the 359
Ohio Association of the Improved Benevolent and Protective Order 360
of the Elks of the World, which shall use the funds for 361
charitable purposes. 362

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 363
receives pursuant to section 4503.71 of the Revised Code to the 364
fraternal order of police of Ohio, incorporated, which shall 365
deposit the fees into its general account to be used for 366
purposes of the fraternal order of police of Ohio, incorporated. 367

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 368
receives pursuant to section 4503.711 of the Revised Code to the 369
fraternal order of police of Ohio, incorporated, which shall 370
deposit the contributions into an account that it creates to be 371
used for the purpose of advancing and protecting the law 372
enforcement profession, promoting improved law enforcement 373
methods, and teaching respect for law and order. 374

The registrar shall pay the contributions received 375
pursuant to section 4503.712 of the Revised Code to Ohio 376
concerns of police survivors, which shall use those 377
contributions to provide whatever assistance may be appropriate 378
to the families of Ohio law enforcement officers who are killed 379
in the line of duty. 380

The registrar shall pay the contributions received 381
pursuant to section 4503.713 of the Revised Code to the greater 382
Cleveland peace officers memorial society, which shall use those 383
contributions to honor law enforcement officers who have died in 384
the line of duty and support its charitable purposes. 385

The registrar shall pay the contributions received 386
pursuant to section 4503.714 of the Revised Code to the Ohio 387
association of chiefs of police. 388

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 389
receives pursuant to section 4503.715 of the Revised Code to the 390
fallen linemen organization, which shall use the contributions 391
to recognize and memorialize fallen linemen and support their 392
families. 393

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 394
receives pursuant to section 4503.716 of the Revised Code to the 395
fallen timbers battlefield preservation commission, which shall 396

use the contributions to further the mission of the commission. 397

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 398
receives pursuant to section 4503.72 of the Revised Code to the 399
organization known on March 31, 2003, as the Ohio CASA/GAL 400
association, a private, nonprofit corporation organized under 401
Chapter 1702. of the Revised Code. The Ohio CASA/GAL association 402
shall use these contributions to pay the expenses it incurs in 403
administering a program to secure the proper representation in 404
the courts of this state of abused, neglected, and dependent 405
children, and for the training and supervision of persons 406
participating in that program. 407

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 408
receives pursuant to section 4503.722 of the Revised Code to the 409
Down Syndrome Association of Central Ohio, which shall use the 410
contributions for advocacy purposes throughout the state. 411

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 412
receives pursuant to section 4503.724 of the Revised Code to the 413
Ohio Chapter of the American Foundation for Suicide Prevention, 414
which shall use the contributions for programs, education, and 415
advocacy purposes throughout the state. 416

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 417
receives pursuant to section 4503.725 of the Revised Code to the 418
ALS association central & southern Ohio chapter, which shall 419
split the contributions between that chapter and the ALS 420
association northern Ohio chapter in accordance with any 421
agreement between the two associations. The contributions shall 422
be used to discover treatments and a cure for ALS, and to serve, 423
advocate for, and empower people affected by ALS to live their 424
lives to the fullest. 425

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 426
receives pursuant to section 4503.73 of the Revised Code to 427
Wright B. Flyer, incorporated, which shall deposit the 428
contributions into its general account to be used for purposes 429
of Wright B. Flyer, incorporated. 430

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 431
receives pursuant to section 4503.732 of the Revised Code to the 432
Siegel Shuster society, a nonprofit organization dedicated to 433
commemorating and celebrating the creation of Superman in 434
Cleveland, Ohio. 435

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 436
receives pursuant to section 4503.733 of the Revised Code to the 437
central Ohio chapter of the juvenile diabetes research 438
foundation, which shall distribute the contributions to the 439
chapters of the juvenile diabetes research foundation in whose 440
geographic territory the person who paid the contribution 441
resides. 442

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 443
receives pursuant to section 4503.734 of the Revised Code to the 444
Ohio highway patrol auxiliary foundation, which shall use the 445
contributions to fulfill the foundation's mission of supporting 446
law enforcement education and assistance. 447

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 448
receives pursuant to section 4503.74 of the Revised Code to the 449
Columbus zoological park association, which shall disburse the 450
moneys to Ohio's major metropolitan zoos, as defined in section 451
4503.74 of the Revised Code, in accordance with a written 452
agreement entered into by the major metropolitan zoos. 453

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 454

receives pursuant to section 4503.75 of the Revised Code to the 455
rotary foundation, located on March 31, 2003, in Evanston, 456
Illinois, to be placed in a fund known as the permanent fund and 457
used to endow educational and humanitarian programs of the 458
rotary foundation. 459

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 460
receives pursuant to section 4503.751 of the Revised Code to the 461
Ohio association of realtors, which shall deposit the 462
contributions into a property disaster relief fund maintained 463
under the Ohio realtors charitable and education foundation. 464

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 465
receives pursuant to section 4503.752 of the Revised Code to 466
buckeye corvettes, incorporated, which shall use the 467
contributions to pay for its charitable activities and programs. 468

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 469
receives pursuant to section 4503.754 of the Revised Code to the 470
municipal corporation of Twinsburg. 471

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 472
receives pursuant to section 4503.763 of the Revised Code to the 473
Ohio history connection to be used solely to build, support, and 474
maintain the Ohio battleflag collection within the Ohio history 475
connection. 476

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 477
receives pursuant to section 4503.764 of the Revised Code to the 478
Medina county historical society, which shall use those 479
contributions to distribute between the various historical 480
societies and museums in Medina county. 481

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 482
receives pursuant to section 4503.765 of the Revised Code to the 483

Amaranth grand chapter foundation, which shall use the 484
contributions for communal outreach, charitable service, and 485
scholarship purposes. 486

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 487
receives pursuant to section 4503.767 of the Revised Code to 488
folds of honor of central Ohio, which shall use the 489
contributions to provide scholarships to spouses and children 490
either of disabled veterans or of members of any branch of the 491
armed forces who died during their service. 492

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 493
receives pursuant to section 4503.85 of the Revised Code to the 494
Ohio sea grant college program to be used for Lake Erie area 495
research projects. 496

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 497
receives pursuant to section 4503.86 of the Revised Code to the 498
Ohio Lincoln highway historic byway, which shall use those 499
contributions solely to promote and support the historical 500
preservation and advertisement of the Lincoln highway in this 501
state. 502

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 503
receives pursuant to section 4503.87 of the Revised Code to the 504
Grove City little league dream field fund, which shall use those 505

receives pursuant to section 4503.962 of the Revised Code to 1038
Hamilton high school located in the municipal corporation of 1039
Hamilton. The high school shall not use the contributions for 1040
any political purpose. 1041

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 1042
receives pursuant to section 4503.963 of the Revised Code to 1043
Ross high school located in Ross township in Butler county. The 1044
high school shall not use the contributions for any political 1045
purpose. 1046

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 1047
receives pursuant to section 4503.97 of the Revised Code to the 1048
friends of united Hatzalah of Israel, which shall use the money 1049
to support united Hatzalah of Israel, which provides free 1050
emergency medical first response throughout Israel. 1051

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 1052
receives pursuant to section 4503.98 of the Revised Code to the 1053
Westerville parks foundation to support the programs and 1054
activities of the foundation and its mission of pursuing the 1055
city of Westerville's vision of becoming "A City Within A Park." 1056

(C) All investment earnings of the license plate 1057
contribution fund shall be credited to the fund. Not later than 1058
the first day of May of every year, the registrar shall 1059

distribute to each entity described in division (B) of this 1060
section the investment income the fund earned the previous 1061
calendar year. The amount of such a distribution paid to an 1062
entity shall be proportionate to the amount of money the entity 1063
received from the fund during the previous calendar year. 1064

Sec. 4503.519. (A) (1) The owner or lessee of any passenger 1065
car, noncommercial motor vehicle, recreational vehicle, or other 1066
vehicle of a class approved by the registrar of motor vehicles 1067
may apply to the registrar for the registration of the vehicle 1068
and issuance of "Recovery is Beautiful" license plates. The 1069
application may be combined with a request for a special 1070
reserved license plate under section 4503.40 or 4503.42 of the 1071
Revised Code. Upon receipt of the completed application and 1072
compliance by the applicant with divisions (B) and (C) of this 1073
section, the registrar shall issue to the applicant the 1074
appropriate vehicle registration and a set of "Recovery is 1075
Beautiful" license plates and a validation sticker, or a 1076
validation sticker alone when required by section 4503.191 of 1077
the Revised Code. 1078

(2) In addition to the letters and numbers ordinarily 1079
inscribed on the license plates, "Recovery is Beautiful" license 1080
plates shall display an appropriate logo and words that are 1081
approved by the registrar after being jointly selected by all of 1082
the following: 1083

(a) NAMI Ohio (national alliance on mental illness of 1084
Ohio); 1085

(b) OCAAR (Ohio citizen advocates for addiction recovery); 1086

(c) Ohio PRO (Ohio peer recovery organizations); 1087

(d) The Ohio council; 1088

(e) OACBHA (Ohio association of county behavioral health 1089
authorities). 1090

(3) "Recovery is Beautiful" license plates shall display 1091
county identification stickers that identify the county of 1092
registration as required under section 4503.19 of the Revised 1093
Code. 1094

(B) "Recovery is Beautiful" license plates and a 1095
validation sticker, or validation sticker alone, shall be issued 1096
upon receipt of an application for registration of a motor 1097
vehicle under this section; payment of the regular license tax 1098
as prescribed under section 4503.04 of the Revised Code, any 1099
applicable motor vehicle license tax levied under Chapter 4504. 1100
of the Revised Code, any applicable additional fee prescribed by 1101
section 4503.40 or 4503.42 of the Revised Code, an additional 1102
administrative fee of ten dollars, and a contribution as 1103
provided in division (C) (1) of this section; and compliance with 1104
all other applicable laws relating to the registration of motor 1105
vehicles. 1106

(C) (1) For each application for registration and 1107
registration renewal notice the registrar receives under this 1108
section, the registrar shall collect a contribution of twenty 1109
dollars. The registrar shall deposit this contribution into the 1110
state treasury to the credit of the license plate contribution 1111
fund created in section 4501.21 of the Revised Code. 1112

(2) The registrar shall deposit the administrative fee of 1113
ten dollars, the purpose of which is to compensate the bureau of 1114
motor vehicles for additional services required in the issuing 1115
of "Recovery is Beautiful" license plates, into the state 1116
treasury to the credit of the public safety - highway purposes 1117
fund created in section 4501.06 of the Revised Code. 1118
