AN ACT

To provide for joint reports by relevant Federal agencies to Congress regarding incidents of terrorism, and for other purposes.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
- 3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.
- 4 This Act may be cited as the "Reporting Efficiently
- 5 to Proper Officials in Response to Terrorism Act of 2021"
- 6 or the "REPORT Act".
- 7 SEC. 2. DUTY TO REPORT.
- 8 (a) In General.—Whenever an act of terrorism oc-
- 9 curs in the United States, the Secretary of Homeland Se-
- 10 curity, the Attorney General, the Director of the Federal

- 1 Bureau of Investigation, and, as appropriate, the head of
- 2 the National Counterterrorism Center, shall submit to the
- 3 appropriate congressional committees, by not later than
- 4 one year after the completion of the investigation con-
- 5 cerning such act by the primary Government agency con-
- 6 ducting such investigation, an unclassified report (which
- 7 may be accompanied by a classified annex) concerning
- 8 such act.
- 9 (b) Content of Reports.—A report under this sec-
- 10 tion shall—
- 11 (1) include a statement of the facts of the act
- of terrorism referred to in subsection (a), as known
- at the time of the report;
- 14 (2) identify any gaps in homeland or national
- security that could be addressed to prevent future
- acts of terrorism; and
- 17 (3) include any recommendations for additional
- measures that could be taken to improve homeland
- or national security, including recommendations re-
- lating to potential changes in law enforcement prac-
- 21 tices or changes in law, with particular attention to
- changes that could help prevent future acts of ter-
- 23 rorism.
- 24 (c) Exception.—

1	(1) IN GENERAL.—If the Secretary of Home-
2	land Security, the Attorney General, the Director of
3	the Federal Bureau of Investigation, or, as appro-
4	priate, the head of the National Counterterrorism
5	Center determines any information described in sub-
6	section (b) required to be reported in accordance
7	with subsection (a) could jeopardize an ongoing in-
8	vestigation or prosecution, the Secretary, Attorney
9	General, Director, or head, as the case may be—
10	(A) may withhold from reporting such in-
11	formation; and
12	(B) shall notify the appropriate congres-
13	sional committees of such determination.
14	(2) Saving Provision.—Withholding of infor-
15	mation pursuant to a determination under para-
16	graph (1) shall not affect in any manner the respon-
17	sibility to submit a report required under subsection
18	(a) containing other information described in sub-
19	section (b) not subject to such determination.
20	(d) Definitions.—In this section:
21	(1) ACT OF TERRORISM.—The term "act of ter-
