#### AN ACT

To establish the Amache National Historic Site in the State of Colorado as a Unit of the National Park System, and for other purposes.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
- 3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.
- 4 This Act may be cited as the "Amache National His-
- 5 toric Site Act".
- 6 SEC. 2. DEFINITIONS.
- 7 In this Act:

(1) MAP.—The term "Map" means the map en-1 2 titled "Amache National Historical Site Proposed Boundary", numbered 100/175348 and dated July 3 2021. 4 (2) National Historic Site.—The term "National Historic Site" means the Amache National 6 7 Historic Site established by section 3(a). 8 (3) Secretary.—The term "Secretary" means 9 the Secretary of the Interior. 10 SEC. 3. AMACHE NATIONAL HISTORIC SITE. 11 (a) Establishment.—Subject to subsection (c), 12 there is established the Amache National Historic Site in the State of Colorado as a unit of the National Park Sys-14 tem. 15 (b) Purpose.—The purpose of the National Historic Site is to preserve, protect, and interpret for the benefit 16 of present and future generations resources associated 17 with— 18 19 (1) the incarceration of civilians of Japanese 20 ancestry during World War II at Amache, also 21 known as the Granada Relocation Center, and the military service of center incarcerees; 22 23 (2) public reaction in the State of Colorado to 24 the incarceration of Japanese Americans, including

- the position of Governor Ralph Carr and the local
  community; and
  (3) the transition of the incarcerees and their
- descendants following the closure of the center and resettlement in the State of Colorado and other States.
- 7 (c) Determination by the Secretary.—The Na-
- 8 tional Historic Site shall not be established until the date
- 9 on which the Secretary determines that a sufficient quan-
- 10 tity of land or interests in land has been acquired to con-
- 11 stitute a manageable park unit.
- 12 (d) Notice.—Not later than 30 days after the Sec-
- 13 retary makes a determination under subsection (c), the
- 14 Secretary shall publish in the Federal Register notice of
- 15 the establishment of the National Historic Site.
- 16 (e) Boundary; Map.—
- 17 (1) BOUNDARY.—The boundary of the National
- 18 Historic Site shall be as generally depicted on the
- 19 Map.
- 20 (2) AVAILABILITY OF MAP.—The Map shall be
- on file and available for public inspection in the ap-
- propriate offices of the National Park Service.
- 23 (f) Land Acquisition Authority.—The Secretary
- 24 may acquire any land or interests in land located within

1	the boundary of the Camp Amache National Historic					
2	Landmark, as generally depicted on the Map, by—					
3	(1) donation;					
4	(2) purchase from a willing seller with donated					
5	or appropriated Funds; or					
6	(3) exchange.					
7	(g) Addition to Boundary.—Any lands or inter-					
8	ests in land acquired under paragraph (1) subsection (f)					
9	shall be included within the boundary of the National His-					
10	toric Site.					
11	(h) Administration.—					
12	(1) In General.—The Secretary shall admin-					
13	ister the National Historic Site in accordance with—					
14	(A) this Act; and					
15	(B) the laws generally applicable to units					
16	of the National Park System.					
17	(2) Management plan.—					
18	(A) DEADLINE FOR COMPLETION.—Not					
19	later than 3 years after the date on which funds					
20	are first made available to the Secretary for					
21	this purpose, the Secretary shall prepare a gen-					
22	eral management plan for the National Historic					
23	Site in accordance with section 100502 of title					
24	54, United States Code.					

- 1 (B) Submission to congress.—On completion of the general management plan under subparagraph (A), the Secretary shall submit to the Committee on Energy and Natural Resources of the Senate and the Committee on Natural Resources of the House of Representatives the general management plan prepared under that subparagraph.
- 9 (i) ADMINISTRATIVE FACILITIES.—For the purposes 10 of ensuring the preservation, protection, and proper man11 agement of the site and associated resources, the Sec12 retary may establish facilities for administration, visitor 13 services, and curation of personal property, outside the 14 boundary of, and in the vicinity of, the National Historic 15 Site.
- 16 (j) COOPERATIVE AGREEMENTS.—The Secretary17 may enter into agreements with—
- 18 (1) the public or private entities for the purpose 19 of establishing and operating facilities outside of the 20 boundary of the National Historic Site for adminis-21 tration, visitor services and curation of personal 22 property; and
- 23 (2) other public or private entities for the pur-24 poses of carrying out this Act.

1	(k) Effect on Water Rights.—Except as pro-					
2	vided for in subsection (l), nothing in this Act shall af-					
3	fect—					
4	(1) the use, allocation, ownership, or control, in					
5	existence on the date of the enactment of any water,					
6	water right, or any other valid existing right;					
7	(2) any vested absolute or decreed condition					
8	water right in existence on the date of the enact					
9	ment;					
10	(3) any interstate water compact in existence					
11	on the date of the enactment; or					
12	(4) State jurisdiction over any water law.					
13	(l) Operation and Maintenance of Water In-					
14	FRASTRUCTURE AND APPURTENANCES.—					
15	(1) The town of Granada, Colorado, shall main-					
16	tain responsibility for the operation and maintenance					
17	(1) Effect.—Nothing in this Act affects the au-					
18	thority of the town of Granada, Colorado, with re-					
19	spect to the operation and maintenance of all water					
20	infrastructure, systems and appurtenances located					
21	within the boundary of the National Historic Site in					
22	existence on the date of enactment of this Act, in-					
23	cluding but not limited to wells, pumps, tanks, water					
24	lines, valves, and water treatment facilities.					
25	(2) The Secretary shall provide the town of					

- (2) Determination.—The Secretary shall provide the town of Granada, Colorado, with access to those areas of the National Historic Site determined as necessary for the operation and maintenance of water infrastructure and appurtenances.
  - (3) The Secretary may permit the city of Granada, Colorado, to construct or install new water infrastructure, systems and appurtenances consistent with applicable laws, limited only to those areas determined in subsection (i)(2), and in a manner that ensures the preservation, protection, and proper management of the National Historic Site.
  - (4) At such time that all water infrastructure, systems and appurtenances located within the boundary of the National Historic Site are no longer utilized by the city of Granada, Colorado, associated improvements and associated water rights may be acquired through donation to and made part of the National Historic Site in a condition satisfactory to the Secretary.
  - (3) New water infrastructure.—The Secretary may permit the town of Granada, Colorado, to construct or install new water infrastructure, systems, or appurtenances—
- 25 (A) consistent with applicable laws;

1	(B) limited to the areas determined to be
2	necessary under paragraph (2); and
3	(C) in a manner that ensures the preserva-
4	tion, protection, and proper management of the
5	National Historic Site.
6	(4) Acceptance of donated water infra-
7	STRUCTURE.—The Secretary may accept, for addition
8	to and administration as part of the National His-
9	toric Site, the donation of water infrastructure, sys-
10	tems, or appurtenances within the boundary of the
11	National Historic Site, including associated water
12	rights, if the water infrastructure, systems, or appur-
13	tenances are no longer used by the town of Granada,
14	Colorado.

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
