## A BILL

To provide for the health coverage of Members of Congress to be affected if the rate of individuals without health insurance increases.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
- 3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.
- 4 This Act may be cited as the "Hold Congress Ac-
- 5 countable on Healthcare Act".

1	SEC. 2. MEMBERS OF CONGRESS HEALTH COVERAGE AF
2	FECTED IF CERTAIN HEALTH INSURANCE
3	PROTECTIONS ARE NOT SATISFIED.
4	(a) In General.—Notwithstanding any other provi-
5	sion of law, subject to subsection (b), Members of Con-
6	gress—
7	(1) will no longer be eligible to be enrolled
8	under a health plan offered through an Exchange es-
9	tablished under the Patient Protection and Afford-
10	able Care Act;
11	(2) will no longer be eligible to be enrolled for
12	a health plan under the Federal Employees Health
13	Benefit Program under chapter 89 of title 5, United
14	States Code;
15	(3) will no longer be eligible to be enrolled, or
16	entitled to benefits, under any other Federal health
17	care program; and
18	(4) will no longer be eligible for any Federa
19	subsidy or tax credit with respect to health insur-
20	ance coverage.
21	(b) Conditional Effective Date.—Subsection
22	(a) shall take effect on such date that—
23	(1) legislation is enacted that changes the Pa-
24	tient Protection and Affordable Care Act; and
25	(2) the enactment of such legislation results in
26	the rate of individuals who do not have health insur-

- 1 ance coverage increasing from the rate as of Janu-
- 2 ary 20, 2017.
