Mr. Paul submitted the following resolution; which was referred to the Committee on Rules and Administration

RESOLUTION

Providing for sufficient time for legislation to be read.

- 1 Resolved,
- 2 SECTION 1. TIME FOR READING OF LEGISLATION.
- 3 (a) In General.—It shall not be in order for the
- 4 Senate to consider any bill, resolution, message, con-
- 5 ference report, amendment between the Houses, amend-
- 6 ment, treaty, or other measure or matter until 1 session
- 7 day has passed since introduction for every 20 pages in-
- 8 cluded in the measure or matter in the usual form plus
- 9 1 session day for any number of remaining pages less than
- 10 20 in the usual form.
- 11 (b) Point of Order.—

- 1 (1) IN GENERAL.—Any Senator may raise a
 2 point of order that consideration of any bill, resolu3 tion, message, conference report, amendment, treaty,
 4 or other measure or matter is not in order under
 5 subsection (a). A motion to table the point of order
 6 shall not be in order.
 - (2) WAIVER.—Paragraph (1) may be waived or suspended only by an affirmative vote of three-fifths of the Members, duly chosen and sworn. All motions to waive under this paragraph shall be debatable collectively for not to exceed 3 hours equally divided between the Senator raising the point of order and the Senator moving to waive the point of order or their designees. A motion to waive the point of order shall not be amendable.
- 16 (c) Constitutional Authority.—This resolution 17 is adopted pursuant to the power granted to each House 18 of Congress to determine the Rules of its Proceedings in 19 article I, section 5, clause 2 of the Constitution of the 20 United States.
