A BILL

 - 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
 - 3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.
 - 4 This Act may be cited as the "Supporting Home
 - 5 Owner Rights Enforcement Act".
 - 6 SEC. 2. HYDROPOWER LICENSES.
 - 7 (a) Licenses.—Section 4(e) of the Federal Power
 - 8 Act (16 U.S.C. 797(e)) is amended—

1	(1) by striking "and" after "recreational oppor-
2	tunities,"; and
3	(2) by inserting ", and minimizing infringement
4	on the useful exercise and enjoyment of property
5	rights held by nonlicensees" after "aspects of envi-
6	ronmental quality".
7	(b) PRIVATE LANDOWNERSHIP.—Section 10 of the
8	Federal Power Act (16 U.S.C. 803) is amended—
9	(1) in subsection $(a)(1)$, by inserting ", includ-
10	ing minimizing infringement on the useful exercise
11	and enjoyment of property rights held by non-
12	licensees" after "section 4(e)"; and
13	(2) by adding at the end the following:
14	"(k) Private Landownership.—In developing any
15	recreational resource within the project boundary, the li-
16	censee shall consider private landownership as a means to
17	encourage and facilitate—
18	"(1) private investment; and
19	"(2) increased tourism and recreational use.".
