JUDGES: Creates an additional judgeship for the 21st Judicial District Court

AN ACT

2	To amend and reenact R.S. 13:477(21) and 621.21(A) and (E), relative to the Twenty-First
3	Judicial District Court; to create an additional judgeship for the Twenty-First Judicial
4	District Court; to provide for the election and term of the additional judge; to provide
5	for election sections from which judges are elected; to provide for effectiveness; and
6	to provide for related matters.
7	Be it enacted by the Legislature of Louisiana:
8	Section 1. R.S. 13:477(21) and 621.21(A) and (E) are hereby amended and reenacted
9	to read as follows:
10	§477. Judicial districts
11	There shall be forty-one judicial districts in the state and each district shall
12	be composed as follows:
13	* * *
14	(21) The parishes of Tangipahoa, Livingston, and St. Helena shall compose
15	the Twenty-First District. The Twenty-First District consists of two election
16	sections. Election section one is composed of Tangipahoa, Livingston, and St.
17	Helena Parishes. Election section two is composed of St. Helena Parish and Precincts
18	2, 6, 11, 15, 16, 17, 43, 46, 47, 49, 101, 102, 104, 105, 106, 107, 109, 111A, 115B,
19	119, 123, and 129A of Tangipahoa Parish.

2	A. The Twenty-First Judicial District Court shall have nine ten judges.

4	E.(1) The Nine judges and their successors created by this Section shall be
5	elected at large from election section one and shall have jurisdiction throughout the
6	district. The judges shall be elected for a six-year term at the congressional election
7	held in 2014 and every sixth year thereafter.
8	(2)(a) The additional judge added to the court pursuant to the Act that
9	originated as House Bill No. 442 of the 2024 Regular Session of the Louisiana
10	Legislature shall be elected from election section two as provided by R.S. 13:477(21)
11	and shall have jurisdiction throughout the district.
12	(b) The individual to be elected to the additional judgeship shall be elected
13	as provided by Article V, Section 22 of the Constitution of Louisiana and shall serve
14	a term which begins on the first January first following the effective date of Section
15	1 of the Act that originated as House Bill No. 442 of the 2024 Regular Session of the
16	Louisiana Legislature, and which shall expire at the same time as is provided by law
17	for the other judges of the court. Thereafter, the successors to the judge provided for
18	in this Paragraph shall be elected at the same time and shall serve the same term as
19	is provided by law for other judges of the court.

21	Section 2.(A) The precincts referenced in this Act are those contained in the file
22	named "2024 Precinct Shapefiles (01-10-2024)" available on the Legislature of Louisiana's
23	website on the effective date of this Section. The 2024 Precinct Shapefiles are based upon
24	those Voting Districts (VTDs) contained in the 2020 Census Redistricting TIGER/Line
25	Shapefiles for the State of Louisiana as those files have been modified and validated through
26	the data verification program of the Louisiana House of Representatives and the Louisiana
27	Senate to represent precinct changes submitted through January 10, 2024, to the Legislature
28	of Louisiana by parish governing authorities pursuant to the provisions of R.S. 18:532 and
29	532.1.

1 (B) When a precinct referenced in this Act has been subdivided by action of the 2 parish governing authority on a nongeographic basis or subdivided by action of the parish 3 governing authority on a geographic basis in accordance with the provisions of R.S. 4 18:532.1, the enumeration in this Act of the general precinct designation shall include all nongeographic and all geographic subdivisions thereof, however such subdivisions may be 5 6 designated. 7 (C) The territorial limits of the districts as provided in this Act shall continue in 8 effect until changed by law regardless of any subsequent change made to the precincts by 9 the parish governing authority. 10 Section 3.(A) The provisions of Sections 1 and 2 of this Act shall become effective 11 if and when a work point study by the National Center for State Courts is completed in 12 accordance with House Concurrent Resolution No. 39 of the 2024 Regular Session of the 13 Louisiana Legislature and the work point study concludes the additional district court 14 judgeship is necessary. 15 (B) The provisions of this Section shall become effective upon signature by the 16 governor or, if not signed by the governor, upon expiration of the time for bills to become 17 law without signature by the governor, as provided by Article III, Section 18 of the 18 Constitution of Louisiana. If vetoed by the governor and subsequently approved by the

legislature, this Section shall become effective on the day following such approval.

**Abstract:** Creates an additional judgeship for the 21st Judicial District Court and provides an election section from which the judge is to be elected.

Statistical summaries of <u>proposed law</u> including maps illustrating proposed district boundaries accompany this digest. (Attached to the bill version on the internet.)

<u>Present law</u> provides that the 21st Judicial District Court is comprised of Livingston, St. Helena, and Tangipahoa Parishes. Provides that the 21st Judicial District Court has nine judges, who are elected at large.

Proposed law adds a 10th judge to the 21st Judicial District Court.

CODING: Words in struck through type are deletions from existing law; words <u>underscored</u> are additions.

<u>Proposed law</u> divides the 21st Judicial District Court into two election sections and provides that nine judges are assigned to election section one and one judge is assigned to election section two.

Provides that the additional judge added by <u>proposed law</u> shall be elected from election section two and that his initial term begins on the first January first following the effective date of Section 1 of the Act that originated as HB 442 of the 2024 Regular Session.

<u>Proposed law</u> specifies that precincts referenced in district descriptions are those precincts contained in the file named "2024 Precinct Shapefiles (01-10-2024)" available on the legislature's website. Provides that the 2024 Precinct Shapefiles are based upon those Voting Districts (VTDs) contained in the 2020 Census Redistricting TIGER/Line Shapefiles for the State of La. as those files have been modified and validated through the data verification program of the La. House of Representatives and the La. Senate to represent precinct changes submitted through Jan. 10, 2024, to the Legislature of La. by parish governing authorities.

<u>Proposed law</u> also specifies that if any such precinct has been subdivided by action of the parish governing authority on a nongeographic basis or subdivided by action of the parish governing authority on a geographic basis in accordance with <u>present law</u>, the enumeration of the general precinct designation shall include all nongeographic and all geographic subdivisions thereof. Further provides that the territorial limits of the districts as enacted shall continue in effect until changed by law regardless of any subsequent change made to the precincts by the parish governing authority.

Population data in the summaries accompanying this digest are derived from 2020 Census Redistricting Data (Public Law 94-171), Summary File for La. Population data, statistical information, and maps are supplied for purposes of information and analysis and comprise no part of proposed law.

Effective upon the completion of a work point study conducted by the National Center of State Courts is completed in accordance with HCR 39 of the 2024 Regular Session and the work point study concludes the additional judgeship is necessary.

- 1. Revise the boundaries of election section one.
- 2. Provide that the additional judge shall have jurisdiction throughout the district.
- 3. Remove the requirement that the additional judge be elected in the same manner as the judges elected from election section one.
- 4. Provide for identification of the precincts referenced in proposed law.

5. Make effectiveness of the bill contingent upon the completion of a work point study by the National Center for State Courts in accordance with HCR 39 of the 2024 Regular Session.
