Prescription Drug Repository Program - Out-of-State Pharmacies <u>Revisions</u>		
FOR the purpose of defining "licensed pharmacy" for the purpose of allowing pharmacies licensed in another state to be designated by the State Board of Pharmacy as a repository under the Prescription Drug Repository Program altering the Prescription Drug Repository Program, including by allowing certain entities located in another state to participate in the Program as drop-off sites and repositories, including over-the-counter drugs under the Program, and altering the individuals who are eligible to receive drugs or medical supplies under the Program; altering the persons for whom and the activities with respect to which certain immunity is provided under the Program; and generally relating to the Prescription Drug Repository Program.
