27	(4)	Part	icipants in the HANDS Program shall express informed consent to participate

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1		by agreement on a form promulgated by the Cabinet for Health and Family
2		Services.
3	(5)	Participants in the HANDS Program shall participate in the home visitation
4		program through in-person face-to-face methods or through tele-service delivery
5		methods. For the purposes of this subsection, "tele-service" means a home visitation
6		service provided through video communication with the HANDS provider, parent,
7		and child present in real time.
