SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That Section(s) 9–2801 through 9–2808, the part “Part I. General Provisions”, and the subtitle “Subtitle 28. Department of Service and Civic Innovation” of Article – State Government of the Annotated Code of Maryland be repealed.

15–106.9.

(a) In this section, “residency requirement” means the requirement of a public senior higher education institution that a student has resided in the State for 12 consecutive months to be considered a resident and receive in–State tuition status.

(b) For in–State tuition purposes, a public senior higher education institution shall waive the in–State residency requirement for an individual who has completed:

(1) All service hours for an AmeriCorps Program in the State; or

(2) A service program under the Maryland Corps Program under [Title 9, Subtitle 28] TITLE 21, SUBTITLE 2 of the State Government Article.

(c) A student is responsible for the difference between in–State and out–of–state tuition if the student does not retain residence in the State for the remainder of the school year for which in–State tuition was received.

(A) IN THIS TITLE THE FOLLOWING WORDS HAVE THE MEANINGS INDICATED.

(B) "DEPARTMENT" MEANS THE DEPARTMENT OF SERVICE AND CIVIC INNOVATION.

(C) "SECRETARY" MEANS THE SECRETARY OF SERVICE AND CIVIC INNOVATION.

(A) THERE IS A DEPARTMENT OF SERVICE AND CIVIC INNOVATION, ESTABLISHED AS A PRINCIPAL DEPARTMENT OF THE STATE GOVERNMENT.

(B) THE PURPOSE OF THE DEPARTMENT IS TO PROMOTE SERVICE AND VOLUNTEERISM IN THE STATE.

21-103.

(A) (1) THE HEAD OF THE DEPARTMENT IS THE SECRETARY OF SERVICE AND CIVIC INNOVATION, WHO SHALL BE APPOINTED BY THE GOVERNOR WITH THE ADVICE AND CONSENT OF THE SENATE.

(2) THE SECRETARY SHALL TAKE THE OATH OF OFFICE REQUIRED UNDER ARTICLE I, § 9 OF THE MARYLAND CONSTITUTION.

(B) THE SECRETARY IS A MEMBER OF THE GOVERNOR'S EXECUTIVE COUNCIL.

(C) (1) THE SECRETARY SERVES AT THE PLEASURE OF THE GOVERNOR AND IS RESPONSIBLE DIRECTLY TO THE GOVERNOR.

(2) THE SECRETARY SHALL ADVISE THE GOVERNOR ON ALL MATTERS ASSIGNED TO THE DEPARTMENT AND IS RESPONSIBLE FOR CARRYING OUT THE GOVERNOR'S POLICIES ON THESE MATTERS.

(D) (1) THE SECRETARY IS RESPONSIBLE FOR THE OPERATION OF THE DEPARTMENT AND SHALL ESTABLISH GUIDELINES AND PROCEDURES TO PROMOTE THE ORDERLY AND EFFICIENT ADMINISTRATION OF THE DEPARTMENT.

1 **(2) THE SECRETARY MAY ESTABLISH, REORGANIZE, OR ABOLISH**
2 **AREAS OF RESPONSIBILITY IN THE DEPARTMENT AS NECESSARY TO FULFILL THE**
3 **DUTIES ASSIGNED TO THE SECRETARY.**

4 **(E) THE SECRETARY IS ENTITLED TO THE SALARY PROVIDED IN THE STATE**
5 **BUDGET.**

7 **(A) THE SECRETARY MAY EMPLOY A STAFF IN ACCORDANCE WITH THE**
8 **STATE BUDGET.**

9 **(B) THE SECRETARY MAY APPOINT A DEPUTY SECRETARY AND OTHER**
10 **PROFESSIONAL STAFF AND CONTRACT WITH CONSULTANTS AS AUTHORIZED**
11 **REPRESENTATIVES.**

12 **(C) THE SECRETARY SHALL APPOINT AND REMOVE ALL STAFF IN**
13 **ACCORDANCE WITH THE PROVISIONS OF THE STATE PERSONNEL AND PENSIONS**

16 **(A) THE SECRETARY IS RESPONSIBLE FOR THE BUDGET OF THE OFFICE OF**
17 **THE SECRETARY AND THE BUDGET FOR EACH UNIT IN THE DEPARTMENT.**

18 **(B) THE SECRETARY MAY ADOPT RULES AND REGULATIONS IN CARRYING**
19 **OUT THE PROVISIONS OF LAW THAT ARE WITHIN THE JURISDICTION OF THE**
20 **DEPARTMENT.**

21 **(C) THE SECRETARY MAY CREATE ANY ADVISORY COUNCIL THAT THE**
22 **SECRETARY CONSIDERS NECESSARY AND ASSIGN APPROPRIATE FUNCTIONS TO IT.**

28 **EXPRESSLY PROVIDED OTHERWISE, MAY APPROVE, DISAPPROVE, OR MODIFY ANY**

(F) EACH UNIT IN THE DEPARTMENT SHALL REPORT TO THE SECRETARY AS PROVIDED IN THE RULES, REGULATIONS, OR WRITTEN DIRECTIVES THAT THE SECRETARY ADOPTS.

(G) THE SECRETARY MAY APPLY FOR, RECEIVE, AND SPEND GRANTS-IN-AID BY THE FEDERAL GOVERNMENT OR ANY OF ITS AGENCIES OR ANY OTHER FEDERAL FUNDS MADE AVAILABLE TO THE DEPARTMENT FOR USE IN CARRYING OUT THE POWERS AND DUTIES OF THE SECRETARY OR THE DEPARTMENT.

(H) EXCEPT AS OTHERWISE PROVIDED BY LAW AND §§ 21-205(G) AND 21-206(E) OF THIS TITLE, THE SECRETARY SHALL PAY ALL MONEY COLLECTED BY THE DEPARTMENT UNDER THIS TITLE INTO THE GENERAL FUND OF THE STATE.

(I) THE SECRETARY SHALL CARRY OUT AND ENFORCE THE PROVISIONS OF THIS TITLE, THE RULES AND REGULATIONS OF THE DEPARTMENT, AND ANY OTHER PROVISIONS OF LAW THAT RELATE TO THE SECRETARY OR THE DEPARTMENT.

(I) THE MARYLAND CORPS PROGRAM UNDER SUBTITLE 2 OF THIS TITLE; AND

(II) THE GOVERNOR'S COMMISSION ON SERVICE AND VOLUNTEERISM;

1 **(3) DEVELOP AND IMPLEMENT MODEL PROGRAMS FOR A STATEWIDE**
2 **CLEARINGHOUSE, SKILL BANKS, OR INFORMATION CENTERS FOR VOLUNTEERS AND**

24 **(A) THE ATTORNEY GENERAL IS LEGAL ADVISER TO THE DEPARTMENT.**

25 **(B) THE ATTORNEY GENERAL SHALL ASSIGN TO THE DEPARTMENT THE**
26 **NUMBER OF ASSISTANT ATTORNEYS GENERAL AUTHORIZED BY LAW TO BE ASSIGNED**
27 **TO THE DEPARTMENT AND ANY ADDITIONAL ASSISTANT ATTORNEYS GENERAL**

2 (a) In this [part] SUBTITLE the following words have the meanings indicated.

3 (b) “ADVISORY Board” means the MARYLAND CORPS PROGRAM ADVISORY
4 Board [of Directors of the Program].

5 (c) “Corps participant” means an individual who participates in the Program.

6 (D) “DEPARTMENT” MEANS THE DEPARTMENT OF SERVICE AND CIVIC
7 INNOVATION.

8 (E) “MSY PATHWAY” MEANS THE MARYLAND SERVICE YEAR OPTION
9 PATHWAY.

10 [(d)] (F) “MSY PATHWAY Fund” means the Maryland [Corps Program]
11 SERVICE YEAR OPTION PATHWAY Fund.

12 [(e)] (G) “Participating organization” means a BUSINESS, nonprofit
13 organization, or government agency that:

14 (1) has a focus on community or other service, service learning,
15 volunteerism, or other activities or experiences with a similar mission;

16 (2) hosts a program participant in a service role; and

17 (3) complies with Title VI of the Civil Rights Act of 1964, as amended, and
18 Title 20, Subtitle 6 of this article.

19 [(f)] (H) “Program” means the Maryland Corps Program.

20 [(g)] (I) “Wraparound services” includes:

21 (1) child care;

22 (2) transportation;

23 (3) housing;

24 (4) [mental] BEHAVIORAL health;

25 (5) crisis intervention;

26 (6) substance abuse prevention or treatment;

(7) legal aid;

(8) financial literacy programming;

(9) job search and application support; and

(10) college application support.

(J) “YA PATHWAY” MEANS THE YOUNG ADULT SERVICE YEAR OPTION PATHWAY.

(K) “YA PATHWAY FUND” MEANS THE YOUNG ADULT SERVICE YEAR OPTION PATHWAY FUND.

21–202.

(a) **(1)** There is a Maryland Corps Program in the State administered and managed by the [Board] DEPARTMENT.

(2) THE PROGRAM HAS TWO PATHWAYS:

(I) THE YOUNG ADULT SERVICE YEAR OPTION PATHWAY; AND

(II) THE MARYLAND SERVICE YEAR OPTION PATHWAY.

(b) **[(1)** Except as provided in paragraph (2) of this subsection, the Program is exempt from Division II of the State Finance and Procurement Article.

(2)] The Program is subject to Title 14, Subtitle 3 of the State Finance and Procurement Article.

(c) The purpose of the Program is to:

(1) provide meaningful service opportunities to CORPS participants that will address the social needs of the community;

(2) equip corps participants with the skills that will enable them to successfully make the transition from high school to an institution of higher education or to the workforce; and

(3) provide [scholarships] PROGRAM COMPLETION AWARDS to corps participants who have completed the Program [to be used at institutions of higher education toward vocational certificates, associate’s degrees, or bachelor’s degrees].

(d) The Program is subject to review under § 2–1220 of this article.

2 (a) [(1)] A Board of Directors shall administer and manage the Program.

3 (2) The Board is a body politic and corporate and is an instrumentality of
4 the State.

5 (b)] (1) **THERE IS A MARYLAND CORPS PROGRAM ADVISORY BOARD.**

6 (2) The ADVISORY Board consists of the following members:

7 [(1)] (I) a Board Chair, [jointly] appointed by the [President of the
8 Senate and the Speaker of the House] GOVERNOR;

9 [(2)] (II) two members jointly appointed by the President of the Senate
10 and the Speaker of the House;

11 [(i)] 1. one of whom must represent a service organization in the
12 State; and

13 [(ii)] 2. one of whom shall be:

14 [1.] A. a current participant in a public service program; or

15 [2.] B. a former participant in a public service program
16 whose participation ended during the preceding 3 years;

17 [(3)] (III) one member appointed by the President of the Senate;

18 [(4)] (IV) one member appointed by the Speaker of the House; and

19 [(5)] (V) [two] **FOUR** members appointed by the Governor, one of whom
20 shall be a representative from the [Governor's Office of Service and Volunteerism]
21 **MARYLAND STATE SERVICE COMMISSION.**

22 [(c)] (B) In making appointments to the ADVISORY Board, the President,
23 Speaker, and Governor shall consider:

24 (1) the professional or personal experience of the individual in community
25 or other service, nonprofit management, civic engagement, or volunteerism; [and]

26 (2) the cultural, geographic, racial, ethnic, and gender diversity of the
27 State; AND

1 **(3) AN INDIVIDUAL’S EXPERIENCE AND KNOWLEDGE IN WORKFORCE**
2 **DEVELOPMENT, INCLUDING REGIONAL WORKFORCE NEEDS, TRAINING, CAREER**
3 **DEVELOPMENT PROGRAMMING, AND WORKFORCE INVESTMENT BOARDS.**

4 **[(d)] (C)** A member of the ADVISORY Board:

5 (1) may not receive compensation as a member of the ADVISORY Board;
6 but

7 (2) is entitled to reimbursement for expenses under the Standard State
8 Travel Regulations, as provided in the State budget.

9 **[(e)] (D)** (1) The term of a member of the ADVISORY Board is 4 years.

10 (2) The terms of the members are staggered as required by the terms
11 provided for members on June 1, [2022] 2023.

12 **(3) A MEMBER MAY BE REAPPOINTED BUT MAY NOT SERVE MORE**
13 **THAN TWO CONSECUTIVE FULL TERMS.**

14 **[(3)] (4)** At the end of a term, a member continues to serve until a
15 successor is appointed and qualifies.

16 **[(f)] (E)** (1) A member appointed by the President may be removed by the
17 President for the reasons stated in paragraph (5) of this subsection.

18 (2) A member appointed by the Speaker may be removed by the Speaker
19 for the reasons stated in paragraph (5) of this subsection.

20 (3) A member appointed by the Governor may be removed by the Governor
21 for the reasons stated in paragraph (5) of this subsection.

22 (4) The ADVISORY Board Chair may be removed [jointly by the President
23 and the Speaker] BY THE GOVERNOR for the reasons stated in paragraph (5) of this
24 subsection.

4 SECTION 6. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act is an emergency
5 measure, is necessary for the immediate preservation of the public health or safety, has
6 been passed by a ye and nay vote supported by three-fifths of all the members elected to
7 each of the two Houses of the General Assembly, and shall take effect from the date it is
8 enacted.
