GAO REVIEW. 4 (a) IN GENERAL.—The Comptroller General of the United States shall conduct a review of the transit security grant program under section 1406 of the Implementing Recommendations of the 9/11 Commission Act of 2007 (6) 8 U.S.C. 1135; Public Law 110–53). 9 (b) Scope.—The review required under paragraph 10 (1) shall include the following: 11 (1) An assessment of the type of projects fund-12 ed under the transit security grant program referred 13 to in such paragraph. 14 (2) An assessment of the manner in which such 15 projects address threats to transportation infrastruc-16 ture. 17 (3) An assessment of the impact, if any, of this 18 Act (including the amendments made by this Act) on 19 types of projects funded under the transit security 20 grant program. 21 (4) An assessment of the management and ad-

- 7 (c) Report.—Not later than one year after the date 8 of the enactment of this Act and again not later than five 9 years after such date of enactment, the Comptroller General shall submit to the Committee on Homeland Security of the House of Representatives and the Committee on Homeland Security and Governmental Affairs of the Senate a report on the review required under this section.
