AN ACT concerning
Department of Aging – <u>Long–Term Care and</u> Dementia Care Navigation Programs
FOR the purpose of requiring the Department of Aging to oversee <u>long-term care and</u> dementia care navigation programs; requiring each area agency to establish a <u>long-term care and</u> dementia care navigation program; requiring the Department to publish a certain report on its website; and generally relating to <u>long-term care and</u> dementia care and the Department of Aging.
