A BILL

To require the Secretary of Defense to request modifications relating to certain permits issued under the Federal Water Pollution Control Act, and for other purposes.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
- 3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.
- 4 This Act may be cited as the "Department of Defense
- 5 PFAS Discharge Prevention Act".

1 SEC. 2. STORMWATER DISCHARGE PERMITS FOR DEPART-

2	MENT OF DEFENSE FACILITIES.
3	(a) REQUEST FOR REVISION.—Not later than one
4	year after the date of enactment of this Act, the Secretary
5	of Defense shall, with respect to each permit under section
6	402(p) of the Federal Water Pollution Control Act (33
7	U.S.C. 1342(p)) that applies to a Department of Defense
8	facility, request from the State that issued the permit, or
9	the Administrator of the Environmental Protection Agen-
10	cy, as applicable, approval of a modification to such per-
11	mit, or a revision to an applicable stormwater manage-
12	ment plan, to require—
13	(1) monitoring of discharges of perfluoroalkyl
14	and polyfluoroalkyl substances not less frequently
15	than quarterly; and
16	(2) implementation of appropriate best manage-
17	ment practices or control technologies to reduce such
18	discharges consistent with the requirements of such
19	Act.
20	(b) Funding.—Of the funds authorized to be appro-
21	priated by this Act, or otherwise made available to the
22	Secretary in each fiscal year, for perfluoroalkyl and
23	polyfluoroalkyl substances remediation efforts, not less
24	than 1 percent shall be obligated or expended annually for

- 1 testing for such substances in stormwater runoff at De-
- 2 partment of Defense facilities.

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
