A BILL

To amend title 40, United States Code, to require the Administrator of General Services to enter into a cooperative agreement with the National Children's Museum to provide the National Children's Museum rental space without charge in the Ronald Reagan Building and International Trade Center, and for other purposes.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
- 3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.
- 4 This Act may be cited as the "National Children's
- 5 Museum Act".

1 SEC. 2. NATIONAL CHILDREN'S MUSEUM.

2	(a) FINDINGS.—Congress finds that—
3	(1) the Museum and Library Services Act of
4	2003 (Public Law 108–81) designated the Capital
5	Children's Museum, the predecessor to the National
6	Children's Museum, as the "National Children's Mu-
7	seum'';
8	(2) the National Children's Museum operates
9	under section $501(C)(3)$ of the Internal Revenue
10	Code of 1986 and is organized under the laws of the
11	District of Columbia;
12	(3) the mission of the National Children's Mu-
13	seum is to inspire children to care about and change
14	the world; and
15	(4) the National Children's Museum is located
16	in the federally owned Ronald Reagan Building and
17	International Trade Center.
18	(b) National Children's Museum.—Chapter 67
19	of title 40, United States Code, is amended by adding at
20	the end the following:
21	"§ 6735. National Children's Museum
22	"(a) In General.— Not later than 30 days after
23	the date of enactment of this section, the Administrator
24	of General Services shall enter into a cooperative agree-
25	ment with the National Children's Museum for the oper-
26	ation of the National Children's Museum in the approxi-

1	mately 32,369 square feet of space commonly known as
2	suite C-001 (hereinafter referred to as the 'Space') of the
3	Ronald Reagan Building and International Trade Center
4	for the duration of the retail space license agreement be-
5	tween Trade Center Management Associates, LLC, or a
6	successor entity, and the Museum, dated December 4,
7	2017, including any exercised renewal options.
8	"(b) Contents.—The cooperative agreement under
9	subsection (a) shall include provisions that—
10	"(1) require, for the period in which the Gen-
11	eral Services Administration owns or controls the
12	Space, the General Services Administration to pro-
13	vide rent for the Space; and
14	"(2) terminate such agreement if—
15	"(A) the Museum does not continue to
16	qualify as a nonprofit organization under sec-
17	tion 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code of
18	1986; and
19	"(B) the Museum no longer uses the Space
20	as a children's museum; and
21	"(3) prohibits the Museum from transferring
22	the interest in such agreement.
23	"(c) Source of Funds.—To carry out this section,

24 the Administrator shall use funds derived from—

1	"(1) the Pennsylvania Avenue Development
2	Corporation fund; or
3	"(2) the International Trade Center fund.
4	"(d) Report.—The cooperative agreement under
5	subsection (a) shall require the National Children's Mu-
6	seum to submit to the Committee on Transportation and
7	Infrastructure of the House of Representatives and the
8	Committee on Environment and Public Works of the Sen-
9	ate an annual report on the operations and finances of
10	the Museum.".
11	(c) Clerical Amendment.—The analysis for chap-
12	ter 67 of title 40, United States Code, is amended by add-
13	ing at the end the following:
