To hunt deer during bow and arrow 30 season and black powder season the purchaser must also purchase a bow and arrow or black 31 32 powder stamp.

AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That, on or before December 31, 2019, the Department of Natural Resources shall report to the Governor and, in accordance with § 2–1246 of the State Government Article, the General Assembly on the number of discounted angler's licenses and trout stamps, Chesapeake Bay and coastal sport fishing licenses, and hunting licenses and associated State–issued stamps and permits issued to recipients of the Purple Heart award under this Act.
- 9 <u>SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That</u> this Act shall take effect July 10 1, 2017. <u>It shall remain effective for a period of 3 years and, at the end of June 30, 2020,</u> 11 <u>with no further action required by the General Assembly, this Act shall be abrogated and</u> 12 <u>of no further force and effect.</u>
