- 5 FOR the purpose of establishing the Workgroup on Transportation for Middle and High 6 School Students in Prince George's County; providing for the composition and 7 staffing of the Workgroup; prohibiting a member of the Workgroup from receiving 8 certain compensation, but authorizing the reimbursement of certain expenses; 9 requiring the Workgroup to study and make recommendations regarding certain 10 matters; requiring the Workgroup to report its findings and recommendations to the 11 Prince George's County House Delegation and the Prince George's County Senators 12 on or before a certain date; providing for the termination of this Act; and generally relating to the Workgroup on Transportation for Middle and High School Students 13 in Prince George's County. 14
- 15 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, 16 That:
- 17 (a) There is a Workgroup on Transportation for Middle and High School Students 18 in Prince George's County.
- 19 (b) The Workgroup consists of the following members:
- 20 (1) the Director of the Prince George's County Department of Public Works 21 and Transportation, or the Director's designee or designees;
- 22 (2) the Chief Executive Officer of the Prince George's County Public Schools, or the Chief Executive Officer's designee or designees; and

  2 Metropolitan Area Transit Authority, or the General Manager and Chief Executive Officer's

  4 (c) The Prince George's County Public Schools shall provide staff for the
- 4 (c) The Prince George's County Public Schools shall provide staff for the 5 Workgroup.
- 6 (d) A member of the Workgroup:
- 7 (1) may not receive compensation as a member of the Workgroup; but
- 8 (2) is entitled to reimbursement for expenses under the Standard State 9 Travel Regulations, as provided in the State budget.
- 10 (e) The Workgroup shall:
- 11 (1) identify where Prince George's County public school buildings and bus 12 routes intersect with bus routes of the Prince George's County Department of Public Works 13 and Transportation and the Washington Metropolitan Area Transit Authority;
- 14 (2) identify the software systems currently in use by or available to the 15 Prince George's County Public Schools, the Prince George's County Department of Public 16 Works and Transportation, and the Washington Metropolitan Area Transit Authority to 17 operate and monitor their bus systems;
- 18 (3) estimate, if Prince George's County Public Schools students were to be 19 transported by the Prince George's County Department of Public Works and 20 Transportation and the Washington Metropolitan Area Transit Authority, the:
- 21 (i) cost savings to the Prince George's County Public Schools; and
- 22 (ii) cost increase to the Prince George's County Department of Public 23 Works and Transportation and the Washington Metropolitan Area Transit Authority;
- 24 (4) determine the feasibility and cost of implementing a system utilizing 25 Global Positioning System technology and text messages to inform parents of when a bus 26 is expected to arrive and provide notification if a bus will be delayed; and
- 27 (5) identify a range of options for transporting Prince George's County 28 Public Schools middle and high school students and the cost of each option.
- 29 (f) On or before August 31, 2017, the Workgroup shall report its findings and 30 recommendations to the Prince George's County House Delegation and the Prince George's 31 County Senators in accordance with § 2–1246 of the State Government Article.
- 32 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect June 1, 2017. It shall remain effective for a period of 1 year and 1 month and, at the end of June
