

- 3 (8) (i) At the time a policy of private passenger motor vehicle insurance 4 is initially issued, an insurer may consider the applicant's homeowner's insurance claim 5 history when rating the policy.
- 6 (ii) At renewal, an insurer may not increase the premium for a policy of private passenger motor vehicle insurance based on a homeowner's insurance claim.
- 8 (9) (i) At the time a policy of homeowner's insurance is initially issued, 9 an insurer may consider the applicant's motor vehicle claim history when rating the policy.
- 10 (ii) At renewal, an insurer may not increase the premium for a policy 11 of homeowner's insurance based on a private passenger motor vehicle insurance claim.
- 12 (10) WITH RESPECT TO PRIVATE PASSENGER MOTOR VEHICLE 13 INSURANCE, AN INSURER MAY NOT REFUSE TO UNDERWRITE, CANCEL, REFUSE TO 14 RENEW, RATE A RISK, OR INCREASE THE RENEWAL PREMIUM BASED, WHOLLY OR 15 PARTLY, ON THE GENDER OF THE INSURED OR APPLICANT.
- SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect October 1, 2022.
