8	WHEREAS, Alabama's access to over hundreds of miles
9	of the Black Warrior and Mobile Rivers, the Gulf Intracoastal
10	Waterway, and the Tennessee-Tombigbee Waterway makes it a
11	critical hub in the nation's transportation system; and

13	demonstrated the critical importance of maintaining resilient
14	domestic industries and transportation services to the

6	supported by the Jones Act, the tenth highest per capita among
