## State Government - Office of Legislative Audits - Performance Audits

- 3 FOR the purpose of altering the frequency of certain performance audits of the Board of
- 4 Liquor License Commissioners for Baltimore City and the Board of License
- 5 Commissioners for Prince George's County that are required to be conducted by the
- 6 Office of Legislative Audits; and generally relating to performance audit reports.

- 12 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND.

- 16 (f) (1) At least once every [4] 6 years, the Office of Legislative Audits shall
- 17 conduct a performance audit of the Board of Liquor License Commissioners for Baltimore
- 18 City to evaluate the effectiveness and efficiency of the management practices of the Board
- and of the economy with which the Board uses resources.
- 20 (2) At any time on request of the President and the Speaker, the Office
- 21 shall conduct a performance audit of the local licensing board, as defined in § 1–101 of the
- 22 Alcoholic Beverages Article, for a county or for the City of Annapolis to evaluate the
- 23 effectiveness and efficiency of the management practices of the board and of the economy
- 24 with which the board uses resources.



- 1 (3) The performance audit shall focus on operations relating to liquor 2 inspections, licensing, disciplinary procedures, and management oversight.
- 3 (g) (1) [Beginning on July 1, 2017, and at least once every 3 years thereafter]
  4 AT LEAST ONCE EVERY 6 YEARS, the Office of Legislative Audits shall conduct a
  5 performance audit of the Board of License Commissioners for Prince George's County to
  6 evaluate the effectiveness and efficiency of the management practices of the Board and of
  7 the economy with which the Board uses resources.
- 8 (2) The performance audit shall focus on operations relating to liquor 9 inspections, licensing, disciplinary procedures, and management oversight.
