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1 AN ACT relating to automated external defibrillators. 2 Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Kentucky: 3 → Section 1. KRS 311.667 is amended to read as follows: 4 In order to ensure public health and safety: 5 A person or entity who acquires an AED shall ensure that: 6 (a) Expected AED users receive American Heart Association or American Red 7 Cross training in CPR and AED use, or an equivalent nationally recognized 8 course in CPR and AED use; 9 (b) The AED is maintained and tested according to the manufacturer's operational 10 guidelines; and 11 (c) [There is medical oversight of the AED program by a physician licensed in 12 Kentucky to ensure compliance with requirements for training, maintenance, 13 notification, and communication with the local emergency medical services 14 system. The physician providing oversight shall also work with the AED site 15 to establish protocols for AED deployment and conduct a review of each use 16 of an AED; and 17 (d) Any person who renders emergency care or treatment on a person in cardiac 18 arrest by using an AED activates the local emergency medical services system 19 as soon as possible and, if an entity with an AED program, reports any 20 clinical use of the AED to the licensed physician. 21 (2) Any person or entity who acquires an AED shall notify an agent of the local 22 emergency medical services system and the local emergency communications or 23 vehicle dispatch center of the existence, location, and type of AED acquired. 24 → Section 2. KRS 311.668 is amended to read as follows: 25 Any person or entity who, in good faith and without compensation, renders (1) 26 emergency care or treatment by the use of an AED shall be immune from civil

liability for any personal injury as a result of the care or treatment, or as a result of

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any act or failure to act in providing or arranging further medical treatment, where
the person acts as an ordinary, reasonable prudent person would have acted under
the same or similar circumstances.

- The immunity from civil liability for any personal injury under subsection (1) of this section includes <u>a</u>[the] licensed physician who is involved with AED site placement, the person or entity who provides the CPR and AED site placement, the person or entity who provides the CPR and AED training, and the person or entity responsible for the site where the AED is located.
- 9 (3) The immunity from civil liability under subsection (1) of this section does not apply if the personal injury results from the gross negligence or willful or wanton misconduct of the person rendering the emergency care.
- 12 (4) The requirements of KRS 311.667 shall not apply to any individual using an AED in an emergency setting if that individual is acting as a Good Samaritan under KRS 313.035 and 411.148.
