AN ACT concerning
Board of Trustees for the State Retirement and Pension System – Investment Division – Compensation and Staffing <del>Committee</del>
FOR the purpose of <u>clarifying that the Board of Trustees for the State Retirement and Pension System shall pay certain incentive compensation to the Chief Investment Officer for the State Retirement and Pension System if the Chief Investment Officer retires from the Investment Division of the State Retirement Agency in a certain manner; clarifying that the Board of Trustees shall pay certain incentive compensation to certain employees of the Investment Division if the employees retired</u>
from the Investment Division in a certain manner; repealing the Objective Criteria Committee of the Board of Trustees for the State Retirement and Pension System
and establishing a Compensation and Staffing Committee of the Board of Trustees:




