1 AN ACT concerning

Public Safety – Automatic License Plate Readers – Captured Plate Data <u>Storage</u> and <u>Upload</u>

- FOR the purpose of altering the definition of "historical data" to include automatic license 4 5 plate reader data stored by cloud computing; establishing that certain captured 6 automatic license plate reader data is the property of a certain law enforcement 7 agency and may not be sold for any purpose; establishing that certain captured automatic license plate reader data may be uploaded to the Maryland Coordination 8 9 and Analysis Center; extending a certain offense relating to license plate reader data 10 to apply to a vendor contracted by a law enforcement agency; requiring the Center 11 and certain law enforcement agencies to report the number of license plates unable to be read by an automatic license plate reader during a certain time period; and 12 13 generally relating to automatic license plate readers.
