BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND. That the Laws of Maryland read as follows: 13 14 Article - Education 15 5-202.16 In this subsection, "total direct education aid" means the total financial assistance provided by the State to a county board under the following programs: 17 18 Funding for the foundation program including funds for the (i) 19 Geographic Cost of Education under this section; Transportation aid under § 5–205 of this subtitle; 20 (ii) 21 Funding for compensatory education under § 5–207 of this (iii) 22 subtitle;
