A BILL

To authorize the Keystone XL Pipeline.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
- 3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.
- 4 This Act may be cited as the "Keystone XL Pipeline
- 5 Construction and Jobs Preservation Act".
- 6 SEC. 2. KEYSTONE XL AUTHORIZATION.
- 7 (a) Authorization.—TransCanada Keystone Pipe-
- 8 line, L.P., may construct, connect, operate, and maintain
- 9 the pipeline facilities at the international border of the
- 10 United States and Canada at Phillips County, Montana,

- 1 for the import of oil from Canada to the United States
- 2 described in the Presidential Permit of March 29, 2019
- 3 (84 Fed. Reg. 13101).
- 4 (b) No Presidential Permit Required.—No
- 5 Presidential permit (or similar permit) under Executive
- 6 Order 13867 (3 U.S.C. 301 note; relating to the issuance
- 7 of permits with respect to facilities and land transpor-
- 8 tation crossings at the international boundaries of the
- 9 United States), Executive Order 12038 (42 U.S.C. 7151
- 10 note; relating to the transfer of certain functions to the
- 11 Secretary of Energy), Executive Order 10485 (15 U.S.C.
- 12 717b note; relating to the performance of functions re-
- 13 specting electric power and natural gas facilities located
- 14 on United States borders), or any other Executive order
- 15 shall be required for the construction, connection, oper-
- 16 ation, or maintenance of the pipeline facilities described
- 17 in subsection (a).
