10	WHEREAS, in 1962, President John Fitzgerald Kennedy
11	signed a Joint Resolution proclaiming May 15th of each year as
12	Peace Officers Memorial Day and the calendar week of each year
13	as "Police Week"; and

15	recognize the service and sacrifice of law enforcement

WHEREAS, law enforcement officers across the United 1 States serve with dignity, honor, integrity, and valor; and 2 WHEREAS, law enforcement officers selflessly serve 3 4 their neighborhoods, often at the risk of their own personal safety, and remain resolute in the face of danger, at times, 5 serving as targets for senseless acts of violence; and 6 WHEREAS, law enforcement officers leave their homes each day wearing a badge of honor with an oath to serve and 8 protect, never knowing if they will return; and 9 10 WHEREAS, one hundred and forty law enforcement 11 officers were killed in the line of duty nationwide in 2016; 12 and WHEREAS, there are over 20,000 law enforcement 13 officers' names enshrined on the National Law Enforcement 14 Memorial in Washington, who have made the ultimate sacrifice 15 for their communities and country; and 16 WHEREAS, the State of Alabama recognizes the service 17 18 and sacrifice of the men and women of law enforcement here at 19 home; now therefore, 20 BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA, That law enforcement officers in 21 22 the State of Alabama are most highly commended and this resolution is offered with the heartiest praise and a special 23

prayer for a safe return home each day.
