A BILL

To require the Secretary of Health and Human Services to develop a voluntary registry to collect data on cancer incidence among firefighters.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
- 3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.
- 4 This Act may be cited as the "Firefighter Cancer
- 5 Registry Act of 2017".

1 SEC. 2. PATIENT REGISTRY FOR FIREFIGHTER CANCER IN-2 CIDENCE.

- 3 (a) In General.—The Secretary of Health and
- 4 Human Services, acting through the Director of the Cen-
- 5 ters for Disease Control and Prevention, shall develop and
- 6 maintain, directly or through a grant or cooperative agree-
- 7 ment, a voluntary registry of firefighters (referred to in
- 8 this section as the "Firefighter Registry") to collect rel-
- 9 evant history and occupational information of such fire-
- 10 fighters that can be linked to available cancer registry
- 11 data collected by existing State cancer registries.
- 12 (b) Use of Firefighter Registry.—The Fire-
- 13 fighter Registry shall be used for the following purposes:
- 14 (1) To establish and improve collection infra-
- structure and activities related to the nationwide
- 16 monitoring of the incidence of cancer among fire-
- fighters.
- 18 (2) To collect, consolidate, store, and make
- publicly available epidemiological information related
- to cancer incidence and trends among firefighters.
- 21 (c) Relevant Data.—
- 22 (1) In General.—In carrying out the vol-
- 23 untary data collection for purposes of inclusion
- under the Firefighter Registry, the Secretary should
- seek to include the following information:

1	(A) Identifiable information from a rep-
2	resentative sample size, as determined by the
3	Secretary under subsection (d)(2)(A), of volun-
4	teer, paid-on-call, and career firefighters, inde-
5	pendent of cancer status or diagnosis.
6	(B) With respect to individual risk factors
7	and work history of firefighters, available infor-
8	mation on—
9	(i) basic demographic information, in-
10	cluding the age of the firefighter involved;
11	(ii) a listing of status of the fire-
12	fighter as either volunteer, paid-on-call, or
13	career firefighter;
14	(iii) the number of years on the job
15	and a detailing of additional employment
16	experience that was either performed con-
17	currently alongside firefighting service, be-
18	fore, or anytime thereafter;
19	(iv)(I) a measure of the number of
20	fire incidents attended as well as the type
21	of fire incidents (such as residential house
22	fire or commercial fire); or
23	(II) in the case of a firefighter who is
24	unable to provide information on such
25	number and type, an estimate of such

1	number and type based on the method de-
2	veloped under subsection (d)(2);
3	(v) a list of additional risk factors, in-
4	cluding smoking or drug use, as deter-
5	mined relevant by the Secretary; and
6	(vi) Other physical examination and
7	medical history information relevant to a
8	cancer incidence study or general health of
9	firefighters not available in existing cancer
10	registries.
11	(C) Any additional information that is
12	deemed necessary by the Secretary.
13	(2) Diagnoses and treatment.—In carrying
14	out the data collection for purposes of inclusion
15	under the Firefighter Registry, with respect to diag-
16	noses and treatment of firefighters diagnosed with
17	cancer, the Secretary shall enable the Firefighter
18	Registry to link to State-based cancer registries, for
19	a purpose described by clause (vi) or (vii) of section
20	399B(c)(2)(D) of the Public Health Service Act (42
21	U.S.C. 280e(c)(2)(D)), to obtain information on—
22	(A) administrative information, including
23	date of diagnoses and source of information;

1	(B) pathological data characterizing the
2	cancer, including cancer site, state of disease
3	(pursuant to Staging Guide), incidence, and
4	type of treatment.
5	(d) Methods.—
6	(1) In general.—For the purposes described
7	in subsection (b), the Secretary is authorized to in-
8	corporate questions into public health surveys, ques-
9	tionnaires, and other databases.
10	(2) Required Strategy.—The Secretary shall
11	develop a strategy, working in consultation with the

- (2) Required Strategy.—The Secretary shall develop a strategy, working in consultation with the stakeholders identified in subsection (e), to maximize participation in the Firefighter Registry established under this Act. At minimum, the strategy shall include the following:
 - (A) Identified minimum participation targets for volunteer, paid-on-call, and career fire-fighters.
 - (B) A strategy for increasing awareness of the Firefighter Registry and maximizing participation among volunteer, paid-on-call, and career firefighters to meet minimum participation targets.

- 1 (C) Additional steps that may be required 2 to ensure the equitable representation of groups 3 identified in paragraph (5).
 - (D) Information on how the Secretary will store data described in subsection (c)(1) and provide links to relevant health information described in subsection (c)(2).
 - (E) Working in consultation with the experts described in subsection (e), a reliable and standardized method for estimating the number of fire incidents attended by a firefighter as well as the type of fire incident so attended in the case such firefighter is unable to provide such information.
 - (3) Report to congress.—The Secretary shall submit the strategy described in paragraph (2) to the Committee on Energy and Commerce of the House of Representatives and the Committee on Health, Education, Labor, and Pensions of the Senate not later than 30 days after the date of the completion of the strategy.
 - (4) Guidance for inclusion and maintenance of data on firefighters.—The Secretary shall develop, in consultation with the stakeholders identified in subsection (e), and disseminate guid-

- ance to State health agencies, State departments of homeland security, and volunteer, paid-on-call, combination, and career firefighting agencies that outlines the following:
 - (A) How new information about firefighters will be submitted to the Firefighter Registry for inclusion.
 - (B) How information about firefighters will be maintained and updated in the Firefighter Registry over time.
 - (C) A method for estimating the number of fire incidents attended by a firefighter as well as the type of fire incident so attended in the case such firefighter is unable to provide such information.
 - (D) Further information, as deemed necessary by the Secretary.
 - (5) Ensuring representation of under-Represented groups in registry.—In carrying out this section, the Secretary shall take such measures as the Secretary deems appropriate to encourage the inclusion of data on minority, female, and volunteer firefighters in the Firefighter Registry established under this section.

- 1 (e) Consultation.—The Secretary shall, on a reg-
- 2 ular basis, seek feedback regarding the utility of the Fire-
- 3 fighter Registry established under this section and ways
- 4 the Firefighter Registry can be improved from non-Fed-
- 5 eral experts in the following areas:
- 6 (1) Public health experts with experience in de-
- 7 veloping and maintaining cancer registries.
- 8 (2) Epidemiologists with experience in studying
- 9 cancer incidence.
- 10 (3) Clinicians with experience in diagnosing and
- 11 treating cancer incidence.
- 12 (4) Active and retired volunteer, paid-on-call,
- and career firefighters as well as relevant national
- 14 fire and emergency response organizations.
- 15 (f) Research Availability.—The Secretary shall
- 16 develop and make public a process for de-identifying data
- 17 from the Firefighter Registry and making such data avail-
- 18 able without a fee for research or other purposes. Such
- 19 process shall provide that such data shall be made avail-
- 20 able for such research purposes only if there is an agree-
- 21 ment to make findings, journal articles, or other print or
- 22 web-based publications derived from such research public
- 23 or available to the relevant stakeholders identified in sub-
- 24 section (e).

- 1 (g) Privacy.—In carrying out this Act, the Secretary
- 2 shall apply to the Firefighter Registry developed under
- 3 subsection (a) data security provisions and privacy stand-
- 4 ards that comply with the best practices of the Centers
- 5 for Disease Control and Prevention and provide for data
- 6 privacy and security standards similar to those in the
- 7 HIPAA privacy regulation, as defined in section
- 8 1180(b)(3) of the Social Security Act (42 U.S.C. 1320d-
- 9 9(b)(3).
- 10 (h) AUTHORIZATION OF FUNDS.—To carry out this
- 11 section, there are authorized to be appropriated
- 12 \$2,500,000 for each of the fiscal years 2018 through
- 13 2022.
