21	(1) An annual gross income of \$400,000 or less; or
22	(2) A SEATING CAPACITY OF LESS THAN 50.

- 1 (B) THE OWNER AND OPERATOR OF A FOOD SERVICE FACILITY SHALL DEVELOP AND, BEGINNING OCTOBER 1, 2018, IMPLEMENT AN AUTOMATED 3 EXTERNAL DEFIBRILLATOR PROGRAM THAT MEETS THE REQUIREMENTS OF § 13–517 OF THE EDUCATION ARTICLE.
- 5 (C) THE DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH AND MENTAL HYGIENE AND THE 6 MARYLAND INSTITUTE FOR EMERGENCY MEDICAL SERVICES SYSTEMS JOINTLY 5 SHALL ADOPT REGULATIONS THAT:
- 8 (1) ESTABLISH GUIDELINES FOR PERIODIC INSPECTIONS AND 9 ANNUAL MAINTENANCE OF THE AUTOMATED EXTERNAL DEFIBRILLATORS; AND
- 10 (2) ASSIST THE OWNER AND OPERATOR OF A FOOD SERVICE FACILITY
 11 IN CARRYING OUT THE PROVISIONS OF THIS SECTION.
- SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect October 1, 2017.
