## Election Law – Approval Voting – Authorization for County Elections

- 3 FOR the purpose of authorizing the governing body of a county to adopt, by law, an approval

- 12 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND,
- 13 That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

## 14 Article - Election Law

- 15 8–101.
- 16 (a) Under the supervision of the State Board, and in accordance with regulations
- and procedures adopted by the State Board, a local board shall conduct all elections held
- 18 under this article in the county in which the board is located.
- 19 (b) Except where it would be inappropriate, or as otherwise provided in this
- article, the electoral process for primary elections, general elections, and special elections
- 21 shall be uniform.

- 1 (C) (1) IN THIS SUBSECTION, "APPROVAL VOTING" MEANS A METHOD OF CASTING AND TABULATING VOTES IN WHICH VOTERS MAY CHOOSE ANY NUMBER OF CANDIDATES AND THE CANDIDATE CHOSEN MOST OFTEN IS ELECTED.
- 4 (2) THE GOVERNING BODY OF A COUNTY MAY, BY LAW, ADOPT AN 5 APPROVAL VOTING METHOD FOR ELECTIONS FOR OFFICES IN THE EXECUTIVE OR 6 LEGISLATIVE BRANCHES OF COUNTY GOVERNMENT.
- 7 (3) A LOCAL LAW ENACTED UNDER THIS SUBSECTION SHALL 8 PROVIDE FOR AN EDUCATIONAL CAMPAIGN EXPLAINING HOW TO VOTE USING 9 APPROVAL VOTING.
- 10 (4) THE STATE BOARD MAY ADOPT REGULATIONS GOVERNING THE 11 ADMINISTRATION OF ELECTIONS CONDUCTED USING APPROVAL VOTING.
- SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect June 1, 2025.
