A BILL

To amend section 4501.21 and to enact section 1
4503.724 of the Revised Code to create the 2
"American Foundation for Suicide Prevention" 3
license plate. 4

BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF OHIO:

Section 1. That section 4501.21 be amended and section 5
4503.724 of the Revised Code be enacted to read as follows: 6

Sec. 4501.21. (A) There is hereby created in the state 7
treasury the license plate contribution fund. The fund shall 8
consist of all contributions paid by motor vehicle registrants 9
and collected by the registrar of motor vehicles pursuant to 10
sections 4503.491, 4503.492, 4503.493, 4503.494, 4503.495, 11
4503.496, 4503.497, 4503.498, 4503.499, 4503.4910, 4503.4911, 12
4503.50, 4503.501, 4503.502, 4503.505, 4503.51, 4503.514, 13
4503.521, 4503.522, 4503.523, 4503.524, 4503.525, 4503.526, 14

(B) The registrar shall pay the contributions the 30
registrar collects in the fund as follows: 31

The registrar shall pay the contributions received 32
pursuant to section 4503.491 of the Revised Code to the breast 33
cancer fund of Ohio, which shall use that money only to pay for 34
programs that provide assistance and education to Ohio breast 35
cancer patients and that improve access for such patients to 36
quality health care and clinical trials and shall not use any of 37
the money for abortion information, counseling, services, or 38
other abortion-related activities. 39

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 40
receives pursuant to section 4503.492 of the Revised Code to the 41
organization cancer support community central Ohio, which shall 42
deposit the money into the Sheryl L. Kraner Fund of that 43
organization. Cancer support community central Ohio shall expend 44
the money it receives pursuant to this division only in the same 45
manner and for the same purposes as that organization expends 46
other money in that fund. 47

The registrar shall pay the contributions received 48

pursuant to section 4503.493 of the Revised Code to the autism 49
society of Ohio, which shall use the contributions for programs 50
and autism awareness efforts throughout the state. 51

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 52
receives pursuant to section 4503.494 of the Revised Code to the 53
national multiple sclerosis society for distribution in equal 54
amounts to the northwestern Ohio, Ohio buckeye, and Ohio valley 55
chapters of the national multiple sclerosis society. These 56
chapters shall use the money they receive under this section to 57
assist in paying the expenses they incur in providing services 58
directly to their clients. 59

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 60
receives pursuant to section 4503.495 of the Revised Code to the 61
national pancreatic cancer foundation, which shall use the money 62
it receives under this section to assist those who suffer with 63
pancreatic cancer and their families. 64

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 65
receives pursuant to section 4503.496 of the Revised Code to the 66
Ohio sickle cell and health association, which shall use the 67
contributions to help support educational, clinical, and social 68
support services for adults who have sickle cell disease. 69

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 70
receives pursuant to section 4503.497 of the Revised Code to the 71
St. Baldrick's foundation, which shall use the contributions for 72
its research and other programs. 73

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 74
receives pursuant to section 4503.498 of the Revised Code to 75
special olympics Ohio, inc., which shall use the contributions 76
for its programs, charitable efforts, and other activities. 77

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.499 of the Revised Code to the children's glioma cancer foundation, which shall use the contributions for its research and other programs.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.4910 of the Revised Code to the KylerStrong foundation, which shall use the contributions to raise awareness of brain cancer caused by diffuse intrinsic pontine glioma and to fund research for the cure of such cancer.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.4911 of the Revised Code to the research institution for childhood cancer at nationwide children's hospital, which shall use the contributions to fund research for the cure of childhood cancers.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.50 of the Revised Code to the future farmers of America foundation, which shall deposit the contributions into its general account to be used for educational and scholarship purposes of the future farmers of America foundation.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.501 of the Revised Code to the 4-H youth development program of the Ohio state university extension program, which shall use those contributions to pay the expenses it incurs in conducting its educational activities.

The registrar shall pay the contributions received pursuant to section 4503.502 of the Revised Code to the Ohio cattlemen's foundation, which shall use those contributions for scholarships and other educational activities.

The registrar shall pay the contributions received 107
pursuant to section 4503.505 of the Revised Code to the 108
organization Ohio region phi theta kappa, which shall use those 109
contributions for scholarships for students who are members of 110
that organization. 111

The registrar shall pay each contribution the registrar 112
receives pursuant to section 4503.51 of the Revised Code to the 113
university or college whose name or marking or design appears on 114
collegiate license plates that are issued to a person under that 115
section. A university or college that receives contributions 116
from the fund shall deposit the contributions into its general 117
scholarship fund. 118

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 119
receives pursuant to section 4503.514 of the Revised Code to the 120
university of Notre Dame in South Bend, Indiana, for purposes of 121
awarding grants or scholarships to residents of Ohio who attend 122
the university. The university shall not use any of the funds it 123
receives for purposes of administering the scholarship program. 124
The registrar shall enter into appropriate agreements with the 125
university of Notre Dame to effectuate the distribution of such 126
funds as provided in this section. 127

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 128
receives pursuant to section 4503.521 of the Revised Code to the 129
Ohio bicycle federation to assist that organization in paying 130
for the educational programs it sponsors in support of Ohio 131
cyclists of all ages. 132

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 133
receives pursuant to section 4503.522 of the Revised Code to the 134
"friends of Perry's victory and international peace memorial, 135
incorporated," a nonprofit corporation organized under the laws 136

of this state, to assist that organization in paying the 137
expenses it incurs in sponsoring or holding charitable, 138
educational, and cultural events at the monument. 139

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 140
receives pursuant to section 4503.523 of the Revised Code to the 141
fairport lights foundation, which shall use the money to pay for 142
the restoration, maintenance, and preservation of the 143
lighthouses of fairport harbor. 144

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 145
receives pursuant to section 4503.524 of the Revised Code to the 146
Massillon tiger football booster club, which shall use the 147
contributions only to promote and support the football team of 148
Washington high school of the Massillon city school district. 149

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 150
receives pursuant to section 4503.525 of the Revised Code to the 151
United States power squadron districts seven, eleven, twenty- 152
four, and twenty-nine in equal amounts. Each power squadron 153
district shall use the money it receives under this section to 154
pay for the educational boating programs each district holds or 155
sponsors within this state. 156

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 157
receives pursuant to section 4503.526 of the Revised Code to the 158
Ohio district Kiwanis foundation of the Ohio district of Kiwanis 159
international, which shall use the money it receives under this 160
section to pay the costs of its educational and humanitarian 161
activities. 162

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 163
receives pursuant to section 4503.528 of the Revised Code to the 164
Ohio children's alliance, which shall use the money it receives 165

under this section to pay the expenses it incurs in advancing 166
its mission of sustainably improving the provision of services 167
to children, young adults, and families in this state. 168

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 169
receives pursuant to section 4503.529 of the Revised Code to the 170
Ohio nurses foundation. The foundation shall use the money it 171
receives under this section to provide educational scholarships 172
to assist individuals who aspire to join the nursing profession, 173
to assist nurses in the nursing profession who seek to advance 174
their education, and to support persons conducting nursing 175
research concerning the evidence-based practice of nursing and 176
the improvement of patient outcomes. 177

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 178
receives pursuant to section 4503.531 of the Revised Code to the 179
thank you foundation, incorporated, a nonprofit corporation 180
organized under the laws of this state, to assist that 181
organization in paying for the charitable activities and 182
programs it sponsors in support of United States military 183
personnel, veterans, and their families. 184

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 185
receives pursuant to section 4503.534 of the Revised Code to the 186
disabled American veterans department of Ohio, to be used for 187
programs that serve disabled American veterans and their 188
families. 189

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 190
receives pursuant to section 4503.55 of the Revised Code to the 191
pro football hall of fame, which shall deposit the contributions 192
into a special bank account that it establishes and which shall 193
be separate and distinct from any other account the pro football 194
hall of fame maintains, to be used exclusively for the purpose 195

of promoting the pro football hall of fame as a travel 196
destination. 197

The registrar shall pay the contributions that are paid to 198
the registrar pursuant to section 4503.545 of the Revised Code 199
to the national rifle association foundation, which shall use 200
the money to pay the costs of the educational activities and 201
programs the foundation holds or sponsors in this state. 202

The registrar shall pay to the Ohio pet fund the 203
contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 204
4503.551 of the Revised Code and any other money from any other 205
source, including donations, gifts, and grants, that is 206
designated by the source to be paid to the Ohio pet fund. The 207
Ohio pet fund shall use the moneys it receives under this 208
section to support programs for the sterilization of dogs and 209
cats and for educational programs concerning the proper 210
veterinary care of those animals, and for expenses of the Ohio 211
pet fund that are reasonably necessary for it to obtain and 212
maintain its tax-exempt status and to perform its duties. 213

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 214
receives pursuant to section 4503.552 of the Revised Code to the 215
rock and roll hall of fame and museum, incorporated. 216

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 217
receives pursuant to section 4503.553 of the Revised Code to the 218
Ohio coalition for animals, incorporated, a nonprofit 219
corporation. Except as provided in division (B) of this section, 220
the coalition shall distribute the money to its members, and the 221
members shall use the money only to pay for educational, 222
charitable, and other programs of each coalition member that 223
provide care for unwanted, abused, and neglected horses. The 224
Ohio coalition for animals may use a portion of the money to pay 225

for reasonable marketing costs incurred in the design and 226
promotion of the license plate and for administrative costs 227
incurred in the disbursement and management of funds received 228
under this section. 229

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 230
receives pursuant to section 4503.554 of the Revised Code to the 231
Ohio state council of the knights of Columbus, which shall use 232
the contributions to pay for its charitable activities and 233
programs. 234

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 235
receives pursuant to section 4503.555 of the Revised Code to the 236
western reserve historical society, which shall use the 237
contributions to fund the Crawford auto aviation museum. 238

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 239
receives pursuant to section 4503.556 of the Revised Code to the 240
Erica J. Holloman foundation, inc., for the awareness of triple 241
negative breast cancer. The foundation shall use the 242
contributions for charitable and educational purposes. 243

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 244
receives pursuant to section 4503.561 of the Revised Code to the 245
state of Ohio chapter of ducks unlimited, inc., which shall 246
deposit the contributions into a special bank account that it 247
establishes. The special bank account shall be separate and 248
distinct from any other account the state of Ohio chapter of 249
ducks unlimited, inc., maintains and shall be used exclusively 250
for the purpose of protecting, enhancing, restoring, and 251
managing wetlands and conserving wildlife habitat. The state of 252
Ohio chapter of ducks unlimited, inc., annually shall notify the 253
registrar in writing of the name, address, and account to which 254
such payments are to be made. 255

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.562 of the Revised Code to the Mahoning river consortium, which shall use the money to pay the expenses it incurs in restoring and maintaining the Mahoning river watershed.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.564 of the Revised Code to Antioch college for the use of the Glen Helen ecology institute to pay expenses related to the Glen Helen nature preserve.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.565 of the Revised Code to the conservancy for Cuyahoga valley national park, which shall use the money in support of the park.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.566 of the Revised Code to the Ottawa national wildlife refuge, which shall use the contributions for wildlife preservation purposes.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.567 of the Revised Code to the girls on the run of Franklin county, inc., which shall use the contributions to support the activities of the organization.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.576 of the Revised Code to the Ohio state beekeepers association, which shall use those contributions to promote beekeeping, provide educational information about beekeeping, and to support other state and local beekeeping programs.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.577 of the Revised Code to the

national aviation hall of fame, which shall use the 285
contributions to fulfill its mission of honoring aerospace 286
legends to inspire future leaders. 287

The registrar shall pay to a sports commission created 288
pursuant to section 4503.591 of the Revised Code each 289
contribution the registrar receives under that section that an 290
applicant pays to obtain license plates that bear the logo of a 291
professional sports team located in the county of that sports 292
commission and that is participating in the license plate 293
program pursuant to division (E) of that section, irrespective 294
of the county of residence of an applicant. 295

The registrar shall pay to a community charity each 296
contribution the registrar receives under section 4503.591 of 297
the Revised Code that an applicant pays to obtain license plates 298
that bear the logo of a professional sports team that is 299
participating in the license plate program pursuant to division 300
(G) of that section. 301

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 302
receives pursuant to section 4503.592 of the Revised Code to 303
pollinator partnership's monarch wings across Ohio program, 304
which shall use the contributions for the protection and 305
preservation of the monarch butterfly and pollinator corridor in 306
Ohio and for educational programs. 307

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 308
receives pursuant to section 4503.594 of the Revised Code to 309
pelotonia, which shall use the contributions for the purpose of 310
supporting cancer research. 311

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 312
receives pursuant to section 4503.595 of the Revised Code to the 313

Stan Hywet hall and gardens. 314

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 315
receives pursuant to section 4503.67 of the Revised Code to the 316
Dan Beard council of the boy scouts of America. The council 317
shall distribute all contributions in an equitable manner 318
throughout the state to regional councils of the boy scouts. 319

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 320
receives pursuant to section 4503.68 of the Revised Code to the 321
great river council of the girl scouts of the United States of 322
America. The council shall distribute all contributions in an 323
equitable manner throughout the state to regional councils of 324
the girl scouts. 325

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 326
receives pursuant to section 4503.69 of the Revised Code to the 327
Dan Beard council of the boy scouts of America. The council 328
shall distribute all contributions in an equitable manner 329
throughout the state to regional councils of the boy scouts. 330

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 331
receives pursuant to section 4503.701 of the Revised Code to the 332
Prince Hall grand lodge of free and accepted masons of Ohio, 333
which shall use the contributions for scholarship purposes. 334

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 335
receives pursuant to section 4503.702 of the Revised Code to the 336
Ohio Association of the Improved Benevolent and Protective Order 337
of the Elks of the World, which shall use the funds for 338
charitable purposes. 339

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 340
receives pursuant to section 4503.71 of the Revised Code to the 341
fraternal order of police of Ohio, incorporated, which shall 342

deposit the fees into its general account to be used for 343
purposes of the fraternal order of police of Ohio, incorporated. 344

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 345
receives pursuant to section 4503.711 of the Revised Code to the 346
fraternal order of police of Ohio, incorporated, which shall 347
deposit the contributions into an account that it creates to be 348
used for the purpose of advancing and protecting the law 349
enforcement profession, promoting improved law enforcement 350
methods, and teaching respect for law and order. 351

The registrar shall pay the contributions received 352
pursuant to section 4503.712 of the Revised Code to Ohio 353
concerns of police survivors, which shall use those 354
contributions to provide whatever assistance may be appropriate 355
to the families of Ohio law enforcement officers who are killed 356
in the line of duty. 357

The registrar shall pay the contributions received 358
pursuant to section 4503.713 of the Revised Code to the greater 359
Cleveland peace officers memorial society, which shall use those 360
contributions to honor law enforcement officers who have died in 361
the line of duty and support its charitable purposes. 362

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 363
receives pursuant to section 4503.715 of the Revised Code to the 364
fallen linemen organization, which shall use the contributions 365
to recognize and memorialize fallen linemen and support their 366
families. 367

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 368
receives pursuant to section 4503.72 of the Revised Code to the 369
organization known on March 31, 2003, as the Ohio CASA/GAL 370
association, a private, nonprofit corporation organized under 371

Chapter 1702. of the Revised Code. The Ohio CASA/GAL association 372
shall use these contributions to pay the expenses it incurs in 373
administering a program to secure the proper representation in 374
the courts of this state of abused, neglected, and dependent 375
children, and for the training and supervision of persons 376
participating in that program. 377

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 378
receives pursuant to section 4503.722 of the Revised Code to the 379
Down Syndrome Association of Central Ohio, which shall use the 380
contributions for advocacy purposes throughout the state. 381

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 382
receives pursuant to section 4503.724 of the Revised Code to the 383
Ohio Chapter of the American Foundation for Suicide Prevention, 384
which shall use the contributions for programs, education, and 385
advocacy purposes throughout the state. 386

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 387
receives pursuant to section 4503.73 of the Revised Code to 388
Wright B. Flyer, incorporated, which shall deposit the 389
contributions into its general account to be used for purposes 390
of Wright B. Flyer, incorporated. 391

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 392
receives pursuant to section 4503.732 of the Revised Code to the 393
Siegel Shuster society, a nonprofit organization dedicated to 394
commemorating and celebrating the creation of Superman in 395
Cleveland, Ohio. 396

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 397
receives pursuant to section 4503.733 of the Revised Code to the 398
central Ohio chapter of the juvenile diabetes research 399
foundation, which shall distribute the contributions to the 400

chapters of the juvenile diabetes research foundation in whose 401
geographic territory the person who paid the contribution 402
resides. 403

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 404
receives pursuant to section 4503.734 of the Revised Code to the 405
Ohio highway patrol auxiliary foundation, which shall use the 406
contributions to fulfill the foundation's mission of supporting 407
law enforcement education and assistance. 408

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 409
receives pursuant to section 4503.74 of the Revised Code to the 410
Columbus zoological park association, which shall disburse the 411
moneys to Ohio's major metropolitan zoos, as defined in section 412
4503.74 of the Revised Code, in accordance with a written 413
agreement entered into by the major metropolitan zoos. 414

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 415
receives pursuant to section 4503.75 of the Revised Code to the 416
rotary foundation, located on March 31, 2003, in Evanston, 417
Illinois, to be placed in a fund known as the permanent fund and 418
used to endow educational and humanitarian programs of the 419
rotary foundation. 420

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 421
receives pursuant to section 4503.751 of the Revised Code to the 422
Ohio association of realtors, which shall deposit the 423
contributions into a property disaster relief fund maintained 424
under the Ohio realtors charitable and education foundation. 425

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 426
receives pursuant to section 4503.752 of the Revised Code to 427
buckeye corvettes, incorporated, which shall use the 428
contributions to pay for its charitable activities and programs. 429

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.763 of the Revised Code to the Ohio history connection to be used solely to build, support, and maintain the Ohio battleflag collection within the Ohio history connection.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.764 of the Revised Code to the Medina county historical society, which shall use those contributions to distribute between the various historical societies and museums in Medina county.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.765 of the Revised Code to the Amaranth grand chapter foundation, which shall use the contributions for communal outreach, charitable service, and scholarship purposes.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.85 of the Revised Code to the Ohio sea grant college program to be used for Lake Erie area research projects.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.86 of the Revised Code to the Ohio Lincoln highway historic byway, which shall use those contributions solely to promote and support the historical preservation and advertisement of the Lincoln highway in this state.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.87 of the Revised Code to the Grove City little league dream field fund, which shall use those contributions solely to build, maintain, and improve youth

baseball fields within the municipal corporation of Grove City. 459

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 460
receives pursuant to section 4503.871 of the Revised Code to the 461
Solon city school district. The school district shall use the 462
contributions it receives to pay the expenses it incurs in 463
providing services to the school district's students that assist 464
in developing or maintaining the mental and emotional well-being 465
of the students. The services provided may include bereavement 466
counseling, instruction in defensive driving techniques, 467
sensitivity training, and the counseling and education of 468
students regarding bullying, dating violence, drug abuse, 469
suicide prevention, and human trafficking. The school district 470
superintendent or, in the school district superintendent's 471
discretion, the appropriate school principal or appropriate 472
school counselors shall determine any charitable organizations 473
that the school district hires to provide those services. The 474
school district also may use the contributions it receives to 475
pay for members of the faculty of the school district to receive 476
training in providing such services to the students of the 477
school district. The school district shall ensure that any 478
charitable organization that is hired by the district is exempt 479
from federal income taxation under subsection 501(c)(3) of the 480
Internal Revenue Code. The school district shall not use the 481
contributions it receives for any other purpose. 482

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 483
receives pursuant to section 4503.872 of the Revised Code to the 484
Canton city school district. The district may use the 485
contributions for student welfare, but shall not use the 486
contributions for any political purpose or to pay salaries of 487
district employees. 488

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.873 of the Revised Code to Padua Franciscan high school located in the municipal corporation of Parma. The school shall use fifty per cent of the contributions it receives to provide tuition assistance to its students. The school shall use the remaining fifty per cent to pay the expenses it incurs in providing services to the school's students that assist in developing or maintaining the mental and emotional well-being of the students. The services provided may include bereavement counseling, instruction in defensive driving techniques, sensitivity training, and the counseling and education of students regarding bullying, dating violence, drug abuse, suicide prevention, and human trafficking. Sec. 4503.724. (A) The owner or lessee of any passenger car, noncommercial motor vehicle, recreational vehicle, or other vehicle of a class approved by the registrar of motor vehicles may apply to the registrar for the registration of the vehicle and issuance of "American Foundation for Suicide Prevention" license plates. The application may be combined with a request for a special reserved license plate under section 4503.40 or 4503.42 of the Revised Code. Upon receipt of the completed application and compliance by the applicant with divisions (B) and (C) of this section, the registrar shall issue to the applicant the appropriate vehicle registration and a set of "American Foundation for Suicide Prevention" license plates and a validation sticker, or a validation sticker alone when required by section 4503.191 of the Revised Code.

In addition to the letters and numbers ordinarily inscribed on the license plates, "American Foundation for Suicide Prevention" license plates shall display an appropriate

stickers that identify the county of registration as required 952
