- 20 (5) (I) SERVE AS THE CLEARINGHOUSE FOR HEALTH AND HUMAN
- 21 SERVICES TRANSPORTATION COORDINATION ISSUES IN THE STATE;
- 22 (II) IDENTIFY AND FACILITATE RESOLUTION TO ISSUES
- 23 REGARDING HEALTH AND HUMAN SERVICES TRANSPORTATION, BOTH LOCALLY AND
- 24 STATEWIDE;
- 25 (III) PARTICIPATE IN THE IDENTIFICATION OF POTENTIAL
- 26 ALLOCATIONS OF HEALTH AND HUMAN SERVICES TRANSPORTATION RESOURCES
- 27 DURING EMERGENCY EVACUATIONS;
- 28 (IV) EVALUATE COST-SAVING MEASURES;
- 29 (V) INVESTIGATE THE NEED FOR THE ESTABLISHMENT OF
- 30 STANDARDS FOR VEHICLES AND DRIVERS WITHIN HEALTH AND HUMAN SERVICES
- 31 TRANSPORTATION PROGRAMS; AND
- 32 (VI) EXAMINE OTHER APPROPRIATE AREAS TO FACILITATE THE
- 33 DEVELOPMENT OF A QUALITY HEALTH AND HUMAN SERVICES TRANSPORTATION
- 34 SYSTEM IN THE STATE.

(I) On or before September 1 each year, the Committee shall report on its activities to the Governor and, in accordance with $\S 2-1257$ of the State Government Article, the General Assembly.
SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect October 1, 2023.
