A BILL

To require the inclusion of veterans in housing planning and an annual report on housing assistance to veterans, and for other purposes.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
- 3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.
- 4 This Act may be cited as the "Improving Access to
- 5 Homes for Heroes Act of 2019".
- 6 SEC. 2. INCLUSION OF VETERANS IN HOUSING PLANNING.
- 7 (a) Public Housing Agency Plans.—Section
- 8 5A(d)(1) of the United States Housing Act of 1937 (42
- 9 U.S.C. 1437c-1(d)(1)) is amended by striking "and dis-
- 10 abled families" and inserting ", disabled families, and vet-

1	erans (as such term is defined in section 101 of title 38,
2	United States Code)".
3	(b) Comprehensive Housing Affordability
4	Strategies.—
5	(1) In General.—Section 105 of the Cran-
6	ston-Gonzalez National Affordable Housing Act (42)
7	U.S.C. 12705) is amended—
8	(A) in subsection (b)(1), by inserting "vet-
9	erans (as such term is defined in section 101 of
10	title 38, United States Code)," after "acquired
11	immunodeficiency syndrome,";
12	(B) in subsection (b)(20), by striking "and
13	service" and inserting "veterans service, and
14	other service"; and
15	(C) in subsection $(e)(1)$, by inserting "vet-
16	erans (as such term is defined in section 101 of
17	title 38, United States Code)," after "homeless
18	persons,".
19	(2) Consolidated Plans.—The Secretary of
20	Housing and Urban Development shall revise the
21	regulations relating to submission of consolidated
22	plans (part 91 of title 24, Code of Federal Regula-
23	tions) in accordance with the amendments made by
24	paragraph (1) of this subsection to require inclusion

1	of appropriate information relating to veterans and
2	veterans service agencies in all such plans.
3	SEC. 3. ANNUAL REPORT ON HOUSING ASSISTANCE TO VET-
4	ERANS.
5	(a) In General.—Not later than December 31 of
6	each year, the Secretary of Housing and Urban Develop-
7	ment shall submit a report on the activities of the Depart-
8	ment of Housing and Urban Development relating to vet-
9	erans during such year to the following:
10	(1) The Committee on Banking, Housing, and
11	Urban Affairs of the Senate.
12	(2) The Committee on Veterans' Affairs of the
13	Senate.
14	(3) The Committee on Appropriations of the
15	Senate.
16	(4) The Committee on Financial Services of the
17	House of Representatives.
18	(5) The Committee on Veterans' Affairs of the
19	House of Representatives.
20	(6) The Committee on Appropriations of the
21	House of Representatives.
22	(7) The Secretary of Veterans Affairs.
23	(b) Contents.—Each report required under sub-
24	section (a) shall include the following information with re-
25	spect to the year for which the report is submitted:

- (1) The number of homeless veterans provided assistance under the program of housing choice homeless veterans vouchers for under section 8(o)(19) of the United States Housing Act of 1937 (42 U.S.C. 1437f(o)(19)), the socioeconomic charac-teristics and racial characteristics of such homeless veterans, and the number, types, and locations of en-tities contracted under such section to administer the vouchers.
 - (2) The number of homeless veterans provided assistance under the Tribal HUD–VA Supportive Housing Program (HUD–VASH) authorized by the Consolidated and Further Continuing Appropriations Act, 2015 (Pub. L. 113–235; 128 Stat. 2733) the socioeconomic characteristics and racial characteristics of such homeless veterans, and the number, types, and locations of entities contracted under such section to administer the vouchers.
 - (3) A summary description of the special considerations made for veterans under public housing agency plans submitted pursuant to section 5A of the United States Housing Act of 1937 (42 U.S.C. 1437c–1) and under comprehensive housing affordability strategies submitted pursuant to section 105

- of the Cranston-Gonzalez National Affordable Housing Act (42 U.S.C. 12705).
- 3 (4) A description of the activities of the Special
 4 Assistant for Veterans Affairs.
 - (5) A description of the efforts of the Department of Housing and Urban Development to coordinate the delivery of housing and services to veterans with other Federal departments and agencies, including the Department of Defense, Department of Justice, Department of Labor, Department of Health and Human Services, Department of Veterans Affairs, Interagency Council on Homelessness, and the Social Security Administration.
 - (6) The cost to the Department of Housing and Urban Development of administering the programs and activities relating to veterans.
- 17 (7) Any other information that the Secretary 18 considers relevant in assessing the programs and ac-19 tivities of the Department of Housing and Urban 20 Development relating to veterans.
- 21 (c) Assessment of Housing Needs of Very Low-
- 22 Income Veteran Families.—
- 23 (1) IN GENERAL.—For the first report sub-24 mitted pursuant to subsection (a) and every fifth re-

1	port thereafter, the Secretary of Housing and Urban
2	Development shall—
3	(A) conduct an assessment of the housing
4	needs of very low-income veteran families (as
5	such term is defined in paragraph 5); and
6	(B) shall include in each such report find-
7	ings regarding such assessment.
8	(2) Content.—Each assessment under this
9	subsection shall include—
10	(A) conducting a survey of, and direct
11	interviews with, a representative sample of very
12	low-income veteran families (as such term is de-
13	fined in paragraph 5) to determine past and
14	current—
15	(i) socioeconomic characteristics of
16	such veteran families;
17	(ii) barriers to such veteran families
18	obtaining safe, quality, and affordable
19	housing;
20	(iii) levels of homelessness among
21	such veteran families; and
22	(iv) levels and circumstances of, and
23	barriers to, receipt by such veteran families
24	of rental housing and homeownership as-
25	sistance; and

- 1 (B) such other information that the Sec2 retary determines, in consultation with the Sec3 retary of Veterans Affairs and national non4 governmental organizations concerned with vet5 erans, homelessness, and very low-income hous6 ing, may be useful to the assessment.
 - (3) CONDUCT.—If the Secretary contracts with an entity other than the Department of Housing and Urban Development to conduct the assessment under this subsection, such entity shall be a non-governmental organization determined by the Secretary to have appropriate expertise in quantitative and qualitative social science research.
 - (4) Funding.—Of any amounts made available pursuant to section 501 of the Housing and Urban Development Act of 1970 (42 U.S.C. 1701z–1) for programs of research, studies, testing, or demonstration relating to the mission or programs of the Department of Housing and Urban Development for any fiscal year in which an assessment under this subsection is required pursuant to paragraph (1) of this subsection, \$1,000,000 shall be available until expended for costs of the assessment under this subsection.

(5) VERY LOW-INCOME VETERAN FAMILY.—The term "very low-income veteran family" means a veteran family whose income does not exceed 50 percent of the median income for the area, as determined by the Secretary with adjustments for smaller and larger families, except that the Secretary may establish an income ceiling higher or lower than 50 percent of the median for the area on the basis of the Secretary's findings that such variations are necessary because of prevailing levels of construction costs or fair market rents (as determined under section 8 of the United States Housing Act of 1937 (42 U.S.C. 1437f)).
