Mr. Collins of New York (for himself and Mr. Cartwright) introduced the following bill; which was referred to the Committee on Energy and Commerce

A BILL

To promote competition and help consumers save money by giving them the freedom to choose where they buy prescription pet medications, and for other purposes.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
- 3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.
- 4 This Act may be cited as the "Fairness to Pet Own-
- 5 ers Act of 2018".
- 6 SEC. 2. APPLICABILITY.
- 7 This Act shall only apply to medication for a domes-
- 8 ticated household animal that the Federal Government
- 9 bars consumers from purchasing without a prescription.

1	SEC. 3. PET OWNER RIGHTS TO COPIES OF VETERINARY
2	PRESCRIPTIONS.
3	Not later than 180 days after the date of the enact-
4	ment of this Act, the Federal Trade Commission shall pro-
5	mulgate rules in accordance with section 553 of title 5,
6	United States Code, that include the following require-
7	ments with regard to a veterinary prescription:
8	(1) In general.—A requirement that estab-
9	lishes the rights of pet owners prescribed an animal
10	drug to receive a copy of the veterinary prescription,
11	without having to request a copy.
12	(2) Electronic option.—The rights provided
13	for in paragraph (1)—
14	(A) may be satisfied by receipt of the pre-
15	scription by electronic or other means; and
16	(B) shall include the right to have a copy
17	of the prescription provided by electronic or
18	other means consistent with applicable State
19	law, if requested by a pharmacy or any other
20	person designated to act on behalf of the pet
21	owner.
22	(3) Purchase, payment, and waiver.—A re-
23	quirement that the prescriber of an animal drug—
24	(A) may not—
25	(i) require purchase of the animal
26	drug for which the veterinary prescription

1	was written from the prescriber or from
2	another person as a condition of providing
3	a copy of the veterinary prescription or
4	verifying such prescription under para-
5	graph (1);
6	(ii) require payment in addition to, or
7	as part of, the fee for an examination and
8	evaluation as a condition of providing a
9	copy of the veterinary prescription or
0	verifying such prescription under para-
1	graph (1); or
2	(iii) require the pet owner to sign a
3	waiver or disclaim liability, or deliver to
4	the pet owner a notice waiving or dis-
5	claiming liability of the prescriber for the
6	accuracy of the veterinary prescription, as
7	a condition of providing a copy of such
8	prescription or verifying such prescription
9	under paragraph (1); and
20	(B) may require payment of fees for an ex-
21	amination and evaluation before providing a
22	veterinary prescription, but only if the pre-
23	scriber requires immediate payment in the case
24	of an examination that reveals no requirement

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for an animal drug.

1 SEC. 4. ENFORCEMENT.

- 2 A violation of a rule prescribed pursuant to section
- 3 3 of this Act shall be treated as a violation of a rule defin-
- 4 ing an unfair or deceptive act or practice prescribed under
- 5 section 18(a)(1)(B) of the Federal Trade Commission Act
- 6 (15 U.S.C. 57a(a)(1)(B)). The Federal Trade Commission
- 7 shall enforce this Act in the same manner, by the same
- 8 means, and with the same jurisdiction as though all appli-
- 9 cable terms and provisions of the Federal Trade Commis-
- 10 sion Act were incorporated into and made a part of this
- 11 Act.

12 SEC. 5. DEFINITIONS.

- 13 In this Act:
- 14 (1) Animal drug.—The term "animal drug"
- means a drug intended to be administered to an ani-
- mal that may not be dispensed without a prescrip-
- tion.
- 18 (2) Domesticated Household Animal.—The
- term "domesticated household animal" means a
- companion animal permitted under applicable State
- and local law to be kept in a home for noncommer-
- cial purposes.
- 23 (3) Pet owner.—The term "pet owner"
- 24 means the legal owner of a domesticated household
- animal or a person designated by such owner to
- present such animal to the prescriber for care.

(4) Prescriber.—The term "prescriber"
means a health care practitioner who is licensed to
practice veterinary medicine or other person per-
mitted under State law to issue prescriptions for
animal drugs.

- (5) Veterinary prescription.—The term "veterinary prescription"—
 - (A) means a written, oral, or electronic order from a prescriber authorizing the dispensing of an animal drug for use by a domesticated household animal and normally administered to the animal by its owner, issued in accordance with State and Federal law; and
 - (B) does not include an animal drug administered by the veterinarian in the course of providing acute care.

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
